BELFRY PRAYERS

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

It is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these prayers, and by this means strengthen the connexion of ringers with the Church.

O Almighty God, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the voice of Thy Son, the great High Priest: Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy sanctuary; through the same Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

O Lord, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy Holy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy angels offer Thee in heaven; through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals, Praise Him upon the loud cymbals. Glory be to the Father, &c.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and, finally, by Thy mercy, attain unto everlasting life, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

AFTER THE PEAL.

The Grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost be with us all and for evermore. Amen.

GUILD RULES.



I.—That this Society be called "THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS," and that it have for its objects the promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-ringers for their sacred office, Belfry Reform, and the cultivation of Change-ringing.

II.—That it shall consist of Honorary and Performing Members and Associates, and that the Bishop of the Diocese, being a Member, shall always be Patron.

III.—That Members duly qualified shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a Member and approved by the Committee (hereafter called the General Committee). That the General Committee and Branch Committees have also power to elect Members at any Committee meeting. That no election be complete until the first Subscription be paid.

IV.—That any person subscribing not less than 5s. annually shall be an Honorary Member. Each Performing Member and Associate who is attached to a band in Union, and each unattached Performing Member shall contribute annually the sum of 2s. to the funds of the Guild. But no one shall receive the Certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes. Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells. Associates shall have the privilege of being taught Change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become Members. Such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the Associates or a proportion thereof as determined by the General Secretary.

V.—That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5, and Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5s. No Life Member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI.—That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the Members present shall elect from either the Honorary Members or Performing Members a President, not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being Members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents), Hon. Secretary, hereafter known as the General Secretary, and Treasurer, hereafter known as the General Treasurer, who, with five persons elected from the

Honorary Members, together with one representative from each band in Union, the Secretaries of the Local Branches, and the Instructors, shall form the General Committee of Management, of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time. If a Local Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee Meeting he may select a Deputy (who must belong to his own Branch and be a Member). If a representative Member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee Meeting, he may select a deputy (who must belong to his own band and be a Member).

VII.—That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meetings, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st June in each year; and shall also arrange from time to time for united practices of the Guild.

VIII.—That all Subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose Subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until the arrears be paid.

IX.—That the expense incurred by Members (not being Life Performing Members) in attending Ringing Meetings arranged by the General Committee may, when the funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.

X.—That the ordinary times of practice of each Band in Union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI.—That Bands in Union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals if required to do so by the Incumbent of the Parish.

XII.—That no Member shall take part in any ringing match for a prize; should he do so, he will be liable to immediate expulsion from the Guild.

XIII.—That no Member shall forward any communication to the Public Press reflecting upon any Band in Union with the Guild or upon any Member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall, as early as possible, bring the matter before the Committee, either at an ordinary or special meeting.

XIV.—That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules or to the rules for local Branches shall only be made at an annual or special General Meeting convened for the purpose.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.



1.—Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. The Incumbents of the Parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.

2.—The Secretary of the Branch shall collect and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members, and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual Bands for the past year. He shall also send to the General Treasurer, by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of Hon. Members collected by him), retaining not more than half for local needs, and the Branch Accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary, not later than December 31st.

3.—The election of Branch Officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.

4.—The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award certificates which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.

5.—Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.

6.—The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch Meetings as is given the General Committee in Guild Rule 9, and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule 12.

NOTE.

The Annual General Meeting will be held at Torquay on Whit-Monday, May 16th, 1921. Full particulars will be given in the "Ringing World" in due course.

Report of the General Committee.

The formation of Local Branches has been, naturally, the outstanding feature of the past year. Already the venture shows every prospect of proving a great success. The Local Committees and their Officers have, in general, entered upon their duties with much enthusiasm. In some cases, quarterly meetings were instituted from the start, and have been attended in good numbers on every occasion. These meetings not only afford useful opportunities for members of the Guild to become better personally acquainted, but, what is equally important, enable many of them to practise methods which have previously been outside their experience. Your Committee hope that these quarterly meetings will be further extended during the coming year. Finance has, doubtless, proved an obstacle up to the present, and the scattered condition of some of the Districts has discouraged effort, but, with the increased subscription and the possibility of the re-issue of railway excursion tickets, an increase in the number of ringing meetings should prove possible. Moreover, the success beyond all anticipation that has attended those meetings already held should encourage the more cautious Committees to make a similar venture.

It is to be anticipated that the varying circumstances of Districts will suggest additional methods by which the knowledge and practice of change ringing may be extended. In at least one Branch a monthly District ringing practice has been inaugurated at central towers.

A system has been set on foot under which Local Committees can obtain substantial financial assistance towards the travelling expenses of Instructors to Associate Bands by application to the General Secretary. It is suggested that, wherever possible, two or three Instructors should be sent together.

It was with general regret that the Guild, at its last annual meeting, accepted the resignation by the Rev. G. E. F. Molineux of the office of General Treasurer, owing to his departure from Devon. Mr. Molineux had been Treasurer of the Guild for seven years, and previously to that had held the combined offices of Secretary and Treasurer for fourteen years (since 1899). When he first took office a Bank overdraft was no unusual experience. At the time of his retirement, besides a small working balance, no less than £75 was invested in War Bonds, the employment of which, there is every reason to hope, will be the means of increasing largely the number

of change ringing bands in Devon. No greater testimonial to the zeal with which he collected subscriptions, and to his careful conservation of Guild funds, can be imagined. Your Committee desire to take this opportunity of welcoming to office his successor, Mr. T. G. Bartlett, whose first important duty has been to co-ordinate the finances of the newly-formed Local Branches. The results of this piece of work will be found set out on later pages of the annual report.

It is satisfactory to observe that peal ringing is reviving, especially in the Exeter District. During the year six peals have been rung, consisting of Grandsire Caters (1) and Triples (5). It is greatly to be desired that the next report should contain a record of peals in other methods.

Criticism has some times been offered concerning the tardy publication of the annual report. With a return to more normal conditions in the printing trade, there is no reason why reports should not be distributed during March. But this can only be done provided the Local Secretaries carry out *exactly* the provisions of Local Rule 2, and they will only be able to do this if the representatives of Individual Bands send in their lists of members and affiliation fees early in January in each year.

The preferential treatment in the matter of subscriptions which Associate Bands have received up to the present has been abolished. As a set off against this, the members of these Bands will receive whatever grants are allowed to other members when attending meetings, besides such assistance in instruction as is referred to earlier in this report.

Reports from Local Branches.

EXETER.

The first year's work of the Branch has naturally consisted largely in finding our feet. In doing so, we can congratulate ourselves on having obtained some new honorary members to give us their support, though a few of the older honorary members have not responded up to the time of going to Press.

Three new Bands have been affiliated to the Branch, and show every sign of proving useful members. Steady progress has been made in half-pull ringing on hand bells, and also, to some extent, in the towers. Further progress in this respect is anticipated during the coming year.

Now that the War is over, the ringers of our established Bands are again settling down to their duties, and are picking up once more. A few peals have been scored by older hands, whetting the ambitions of younger ringers to follow in their steps. The opening of the ring of ten at Cullompton and the first peal on these bells by St. Sidwell's Band deserves every credit, showing, as it does, that our Branch is capable of performing the office of church bell ringers when required. We are glad to receive reports that in most belfries fresh hands are being brought on to fill the blank places, and in particular we would congratulate the Topsham ringers on the well deserved award of certificates resulting from long continued enthusiasm and perseverance.

In addition to the newly-affiliated Bands referred to above, inquiries have been received from several intending Associate Bands with a view to instruction in change ringing, and we hope in a few years, by a continuance of the present system of procedure, to show a substantial advance.

The Chairman, Mr. E. Shepherd, has visited most of the Bands in Union, and expresses pleasure at their general efficiency.

EAST DEVON.

Up to the present no District meetings have been held since the meeting in October, 1919, when the Branch was formed. The Bands forming the Branch are scattered over a somewhat wide area, making it difficult to select a centre suitable for all. When the days lengthen out an effort will be made to get the Bands together. Ottery St. Mary has now once more a Grandsire Triples Band, and the members attend practices and Sunday ringing with regularity, often ringing a 336. A quarter peal has also been rung on one occasion. At Sidmouth ringing for Sunday services has been well maintained, but practices have been few owing to illness near the church. The Musbury Band has been engaged instructing new hands, three of whom can now get through six scores of Grandsire Doubles without assistance. The Buckerell Band has also been initiated into the mysteries of Grandsire Doubles.

NORTH-EAST DEVON.

During the past year meetings have been held at Washfield, Bickleigh, Bampton, and Tiverton, with an average attendance of 44, which clearly shows that there is real life in the Branch. Very marked progress has been made at Bampton, Calverleigh, and Holcombe Rogus. The latter Band has been learning Stedman, and can now ring the plain course. At Washfield good headway has been made in teaching new members, whilst from Bickleigh comes welcome news of a few recruits being taught to handle a bell. Regularity

in Sunday ringing is reported from Tiverton, Calverleigh, and Washfield. There is every likelihood of a large number of our younger members qualifying for their certificates during the next twelve months. Instruction has been given by the Branch at Huntsham and Cullompton with good results.

NORTH DEVON.

This Branch consists at present of the Ilfracombe Band, four honorary, and two unattached performing members. In the summer a visit was paid to Lundy Island in the company of the Guild President. Before starting ringing the fittings received some attention from Mr. Bowen's hands, after which the bells went fairly well, and we scored six-scores of Grandsire Doubles, notwithstanding the somewhat disturbing effect on some members of a rough crossing to the Island. In October, the Deanery Meeting of Ringers was attended at Braunton, when again we had to be content with Doubles, owing to indisposition on the part of a member of our Triples Band. Three probationers, it is hoped, will soon qualify for their certificates.

MID-DEVON.

Good progress has been made in half-pull ringing in this Branch during the past year, the most noteworthy being that of the Paignton ringers, who have accomplished two quarter peals—one of Grandsire Doubles and one of Grandsire Triples (Holt's Original). This shows great enthusiasm on the part of this Band, as most of them have only been elected members of the Guild within the last twelve months. The Band attributes its success to the voluntary and untiring efforts of Mr. F. T. Gover. Mrs. Gover was the first member of the Band to conduct a 500 of Grandsire Triples. Dartmouth, also, has been busy under the able tuition of Mr. Hy. Wilkes, who, at St. Clements, Townstall, has brought on a Band now able to ring Bob Minor and Grandsire Doubles. Cockington is still going ahead, and we hope to record peals before very long. Successful meetings have been held at Totnes and Dartmouth. At the latter place Mr. Hy. Wilkes was elected Chairman and Mr. H. J. Hole, Hon. Secretary, for the ensuing year. One "life," four "honorary," and twenty-two other members have been elected in this Branch of the Guild this year.

SOUTH-WEST DEVON.

In presenting the first report of the South-West District Branch the Committee feel that the action of the Guild in dividing the county into District Branches has been justified. Four successful

meetings have been held during the year, and all have been well attended. Excellent ringing has been accomplished, and many young members have been able to ring their first touches in higher methods. It is worthy of note that our esteemed President has attended all the meetings with his Band and also the General Secretary, the Rev. E. S. Powell. Our second meeting was especially noteworthy, as the members of the Branch were the guests of the President at Kelly. Excellent ringing, combined with a beautiful service in church and hand bells after tea, will always be remembered by those who attended. Your Committee regret that the Plympton St. Maurice Band were unable to retain membership. Monthly practices have been held in St. Andrew's and Emmanuel bellfries, and ringing in the four standard methods has invariably been accomplished. The St. Andrew's Band, on the occasion of the consecration of the Bishop of Bradford (the late Vicar of St. Andrew's), rang a peal of Grandsire Triples; they have also scored several quarter peals. The Emmanuel Band are progressing, and several new members have succeeded in ringing their first touches. They ring for both morning and evening service on Sundays. The Kelly Band ring Grandsire Doubles perfectly for service, and are advancing with Bob Minor. They are to be congratulated for instructing the Band at Milton Abbot, and we hope shortly to welcome this Band into the Guild. The Vicar of Charles has granted Monday nights for the District Branch, and, since the beginning of November, good ringing has been accomplished and the meetings well attended. The Holbeton Band keep well together and ring regularly for Sunday services. Your Committee regret that it has been impossible to manage the working of the Branch on present subscriptions. The increased subscription should, however, enable a credit to be shown at the end of another year.
