## BELFRY PRAYERS

### BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE

*Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.*

It is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these prayers, and by this means strengthen the connexion of ringers with the Church.

O Almighty God, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the voice of Thy Son, the great High Priest: Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy sanctuary; through the same Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

O Lord, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy Holy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy angels offer Thee in heaven; through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

### OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals, Praise Him upon the loud cymbals. Glory be to the Father, &c.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and, finally, by Thy mercy, attain unto everlasting life, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

### AFTER THE PEAL.

The Grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost be with us all and for evermore. Amen.

## GUILD RULES.



I.—That this Society be called "THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS," and that it have for its objects the promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-ringers for their sacred office, Belfry Reform, and the cultivation of Change-ringing.

II.—That it shall consist of Honorary and Performing Members and Associates, and that the Bishop of the Diocese, being a Member, shall always be Patron.

III.—That Members duly qualified shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a Member and approved by the Committee (hereafter called the General Committee). That the General Committee and Branch Committees have also power to elect Members at any Committee meeting. That no election be complete until the first Subscription be paid.

IV.—That any person subscribing not less than 5s. annually shall be an Honorary Member. Each Performing Member and Associate who is attached to a band in Union, and each unattached Performing Member shall contribute annually the sum of 2s. to the funds of the Guild. But no one shall receive the Certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes. Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells. Associates shall have the privilege of being taught Change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become Members. Such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the Associates or a proportion thereof as determined by the General Secretary.

V.—That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5, and Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5s. No Life Member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI.—That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the Members present shall elect from either the Honorary Members or Performing Members a President, not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being Members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents), Hon. Secretary, hereafter known as the General Secretary, and Treasurer, hereafter known as the General Treasurer, who, with five persons elected from the

Honorary Members, together with one representative from each band in Union, and the Secretaries of the Local Branches, shall form the General Committee of Management, of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time. If a Local Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee Meeting he may select a Deputy (who must belong to his own Branch and be a Member). If a representative Member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee Meeting, he may select a deputy (who must belong to his own band and be a Member).

VII.—That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meetings, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st June in each year; and shall also arrange from time to time for united practices of the Guild.

VIII.—That all Subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose Subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until the arrears be paid.

IX.—That the expense incurred by Members (not being Life Performing Members) in attending Ringing Meetings arranged by the General Committee may, when the funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.

X.—That the ordinary times of practice of each Band in Union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI.—That Bands in Union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals if required to do so by the Incumbent of the Parish.

XII.—That no Member shall take part in any ringing match for a prize; should he do so, he will be liable to immediate expulsion from the Guild.

XIII.—That no Member shall forward any communication to the Public Press reflecting upon any Band in Union with the Guild or upon any Member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall, as early as possible, bring the matter before the Committee, either at an ordinary or special meeting.

XIV.—That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules or to the rules for local Branches shall only be made at an annual or special General Meeting convened for the purpose.

## RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

---

1.—Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. The Incumbents of the Parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.

2.—The Secretary of the Branch shall collect and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members, and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual Bands for the past year. He shall also send to the General Treasurer, by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of Hon. Members collected by him), retaining not more than half for local needs, and the Branch Accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary, not later than December 31st.

3.—The election of Branch Officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.

4.—The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award certificates which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.

5.—Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.

6.—The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch Meetings as is given the General Committee in Guild Rule 9, and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule 12.

### NOTE.

The Annual General Meeting will be held at Ilfracombe on Whit-Monday, June 5th, 1922. Full particulars will be given in the "Ringing World" in due course.

## Report of the General Committee.

Judging by the reports sent in by Local Secretaries, the past year has been marked rather by consolidation and repair of the waste due to the War, rather than by the breaking of new ground or marked advance in the ringing of new methods. After all, this is only what might have been expected. Special mention is due to the efforts of the N. E. branch where Stedman is being practised to a greater extent among the village Bands than ever before, and what is even more important for the advance of six-bell bands, efforts are being made to introduce Minor ringing. In the S. W. Branch Bob Minor is also being practised in the two affiliated six-bell towers. Your Committee hope that in other districts no opportunity will be lost of following these examples, for while Grandsire and Stedman—excellent in themselves—lead on no further, an enthusiastic band which has mastered Plain Bob and Kent has almost unlimited chances of further progress.

In the Autumn a party of the Oxford Diocesan Guild rang several very fine peals in North Devon, one of Stedman at Pilton, and another of Treble Bob at Northam being especially noteworthy for their perfect striking. In addition to the seven peals rung by members of this party, three peals of Grandsire Triples, two of Grandsire Doubles and two of Minor have been rung by resident bands. Stedman has been attempted though, unhappily, without success. The peals at Topsham and Holbeton were, in each case, the first rung in these towers by local Bands without outside assistance, and congratulations are due to each company on the success achieved.

The Guild at present consists of a membership of 513, comprised of 53 Honorary Members, 4 Lady Associates, 29 Unattached Performing Members, 238 Performing Members attached to Bands, 71 Associates, and 118 Life Members.

### EXETER DISTRICT.

In presenting the Second Report of the Exeter and District Branch, we have followed on the good work done last year and marked progress has been made in most respects. One or two bands are labouring under difficulties through lack of members, but it is hoped that they will make a special effort to obtain additional members and stimulate enthusiasm.

We regret to report the loss of two Honorary Members through death, in Miss Pinckney of Exmouth, and the Rev. M. S. Shaw, Withycombe Raleigh.

Quarterly Meetings have been held at Topsham, Withycombe Raleigh, and St. Sidwells, and the Annual Meeting at Heavitree, all proving very successful, and Members have turned up in very gratifying numbers at each meeting, thereby showing there is no lack of enthusiasm.

One new Band has become affiliated to the Branch during the year, and the Band is showing much keenness and eager to make headway with half pull ringing, and with help from some of our experienced Ringers will soon be making marked progress.

Eleven new Members have been added during the year, including one Honorary.

It is very gratifying to report that good progress is being made in half pull, particularly in Stedman.

A good percentage of the older members in Exeter are enthusiastically helping the younger Bands instead of giving so much time to Peal Ringing, although several attempts have been made at Stedman, without attaining success, but with perseverance we hope to score, not only one, but many peals during the coming year.

### EAST DEVON BRANCH.

The Ottery Branch works well together, and can now ring Stedman Doubles as well as Grandsire Triples. The members are doing all in their power to spread half pull ringing in their neighbourhood. Through their help and the enthusiasm of the local ringers, Grandsire Doubles has been thoroughly mastered at Buckerell and a start should soon be made on Stedman. A good contingent from both Bands attended the Annual General Meeting at Torquay. Sidmouth reports regularity of ringing, and a revival has taken place at Honiton where the bells have been overhauled by Messrs. Stokes of Woodbury, and hopes are entertained of a renewal of change ringing according to the standards of former times.

### NORTH EAST DEVON BRANCH.

The past year has been noteworthy for marked progress in several directions. The membership has increased by almost 50%.

The Stedman method is being practised fairly generally, and Cullompton and Huntsham towers have been added to the Guild; whilst the financial affairs of the Branch are in a satisfactory state. Meetings have been held at Cullompton, Huntsham, Calverleigh, and Tiverton with an average attendance of rather over 40. The visit of the President of the Guild on the occasion of the Annual Meeting in September, was greatly appreciated and his remarks about the necessity for practising more advanced methods are already being heeded. Combined practices for the purpose of learning Stedman have borne much fruit at Calverleigh and Washfield, and have been the means of helping Tiverton. Holcombe Rogus has also made progress in the same method. Useful instruction to learners has been given at Bickleigh and Huntsham, and at the latter tower plain courses of Grandsire Triples have been rung. The importance of regular ringing for the services of the Church needs to be remembered, and therefore particular mention of the fulfilment of this duty at Calverleigh, Washfield and Tiverton is welcome. A report from every tower next year on the attendance for service ringing and at practices is to be desired. The good start at Cullompton does not appear to have been maintained, although several offers of practical assistance have been made. Bampton advanced considerably until the Autumn when the loss of one of its Band caused change ringing to flag for the time, but several learners are now under instruction. A touch of 1921 Grandsire Doubles was rung by the Washfield members on New Year's eve.

#### MID-DEVON BRANCH.

At Paignton good progress has been maintained and the ringing has been regular. As a result of Mr. Gover's efforts in instruction, four members can call touches up to 500, of Grandsire Triples. Young blood has been introduced, and useful instruction given. The Cockington Band made considerable advance in the early part of the year in Bob Minor, and most of the members have rung short touches in Triples by the help of the Paignton Band. The Sunday ringing has been well attended.

A most successful Branch Meeting was held at Upton in October, when the President attended. At his suggestion combined practices were started at Upton and Paignton and have proved most valuable. A quarter peal of Grandsire Triples has been rung at Paignton in which visitors from London, Swindon, Bristol and Taunton took part.

#### NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

The Ilfracombe Band continues its steady work and has rung several 500's of Grandsire Triples, but has been much handicapped by shortage of members. However, several young hands are coming on who should soon be able to take their share in touches on 8 bells. Mr. A. H. Hayward has undertaken, with much enthusiasm, the instruction of a young Band at Combe Martin on hand-bells, but they are seriously handicapped by the bad state of the bells in the tower. There are hopes that at Northam change ringing may be introduced if the difficulty of the transport of an instructor can be overcome.

#### S.W. DISTRICT BRANCH.

Four meetings of the Branch have been held, all well attended, and excellent ringing accomplished on each occasion. The meeting at Milton Abbot resulted in three members of the Local Band joining the Guild. The President of the Guild and General Secretary have attended all our meetings. Four peals have been rung, one of Grandsire Doubles by a local Band at Holbeton, one Bob Minor by a mixed Band at Holbeton, a Minor Peal in three methods at Yealmpton, and a peal of Grandsire Triples at Charles' Church, Plymouth, by a mixed Band.

Lack of progress seems the chief feature of reports from local Bands though the difficulty of supplying a full report of what has been done in the Branch is increased by the unreadiness of Bands to supply information to the local Secretary.

High cost of railway travelling and reduced wages apparently prevent many from attending meetings.

We are hoping the coming year will prove more successful than the last, and now that the Charles' Band has restarted we anticipate that some of the younger members will, in their enthusiasm, advance to higher methods and report greater progress.

All Bands report regularity of Sunday ringing.
