BELFRY PRAYERS

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

It is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these prayers, and by this means strengthen the connexion of ringers with the Church.

O Almighty God, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the voice of Thy Son, the great High Priest: Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy sanctuary; through the same Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

O Lord, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy Holy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy angels offer Thee in heaven; through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals, Praise Him upon the loud cymbals. Glory be to the Father, &c.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and, finally, by Thy mercy, attain unto everlasting life, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

AFTER THE PEAL.

The Grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost be with us all and for evermore. Amen.

GUILD RULES.



I.—That this Society be called "THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS," and that it have for its objects the promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-ringers for their sacred office, Belfry Reform, and the cultivation of Change-ringing.

II.—That it shall consist of Honorary and Performing Members and Associates, and that the Bishop of the Diocese, being a Member, shall always be Patron.

III.—That Members duly qualified shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a Member and approved by the Committee (hereafter called the General Committee). That the General Committee and Branch Committees have also power to elect Members at any Committee meeting. That no election be complete until the first Subscription be paid.

IV.—That any person subscribing not less than 5s. annually shall be an Honorary Member. Each Performing Member and Associate who is attached to a band in Union, and each unattached Performing Member shall contribute annually the sum of 2s. to the funds of the Guild. But no one shall receive the Certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes. Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells. Associates shall have the privilege of being taught Change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become Members. Such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the Associates or a proportion thereof as determined by the General Secretary.

V.—That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5, and Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5s. No Life Member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI.—That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the Members present shall elect from either the Honorary Members or Performing Members a President, not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being Members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents), Hon. Secretary, hereafter known as the General Secretary, and Treasurer, hereafter known as the General Treasurer, who, with five persons elected from the

Honorary Members, together with one representative from each band in Union, and the Chairmen and Secretaries of the Local Branches, shall form the General Committee of Management, of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time. If a Local Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee Meeting he may select a Deputy (who must belong to his own Branch and be a Member). If a representative Member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee Meeting, he may select a deputy (who must belong to his own band and be a Member).

VII.—That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meetings, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st June in each year; and shall also arrange from time to time for united practices of the Guild.

VIII.—That all Subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose Subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until the arrears be paid.

IX.—That the expense incurred by Members (not being Life Performing Members) in attending Ringing Meetings arranged by the General Committee may, when the funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.

X.—That the ordinary times of practice of each Band in Union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI.—That Bands in Union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals if required to do so by the Incumbent of the Parish.

XII.—That no Member shall take part in any ringing match for a prize; should he do so, he will be liable to immediate expulsion from the Guild.

XIII.—That no Member shall forward any communication to the Public Press reflecting upon any Band in Union with the Guild or upon any Member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall, as early as possible, bring the matter before the Committee, either at an ordinary or special meeting.

XIV.—That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules or to the rules for local Branches shall only be made at an annual or special General Meeting convened for the purpose.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1.—Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. The Incumbents of the Parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.

2.—The Secretary of the Branch shall collect and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members, and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual Bands for the past year. He shall also send to the General Treasurer, by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of Hon. Members collected by him), retaining not more than half for local needs, and the Branch Accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary, not later than December 31st.

3.—The election of Branch Officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.

4.—The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award certificates which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.

5.—Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.

6.—The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch Meetings as is given the General Committee in Guild Rule 9, and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule 12.

NOTE.

The Annual General Meeting will be held at Cullompton on Whit-Monday, May 21st, 1923. Full particulars will be given in the "Ringing World" in due course.

Report of the General Committee.

Good progress in one form or another is reported from all quarters. The Exeter Branch has a striking increase in membership, and the other branches record that either new bands have learnt method ringing, amongst which the progress made at Combe Martin and Honiton is notable, or new ground has been broken by the introduction of methods not previously practised. At last there appears to be good prospect that in all parts of the County the undisputed sway of Grandsire is likely to be challenged. Up to the present this advance is not recorded in peals rung. There have been 12 of these in the course of the year consisting of 9 of Grandsire Triples and 3 of Bob Minor, these last being at Holbeton where the parochial ringers scored the first peal of Minor in the county by a local band of Sunday Service ringers. An after war peal of Stedman by resident Devon ringers is still awaited, several attempts in different parts of the county having failed.

The Guild will reach its Jubilee on March 21st, 1924. The form or forms which its celebration should take will have to be decided at the Annual General Meeting, at Cullompton. Meanwhile your General Committee will welcome suggestions from local branches.

The membership of the Guild for 1922 consisted of 72 Honorary, 123 Life, 283 Performing and 115 Associate Members, together with 4 Lady Associates, making a total of 597, representing a net increase of 84 in the course of the year. There were 42 Affiliated Bands as against 36 in 1921, 10 of these being Associate.

Although the event occurred subsequently to the close of the period covered by this Report, it is impossible to leave altogether unnoticed the augmentation of the magnificent Cathedral peal. The arrangements for the ringing on that occasion were in the hands of the Cathedral band of ringers, who themselves opened the ringing on the new twelve. It is not, perhaps, surprising that they were overwhelmed with 300 applications to take part in the proceedings. They were happily able to arrange for about 200 ringers from all over the country to have a pull on the bells in the course of the afternoon and evening. Your President very pluckily climbed the many stairs to the Cathedral belfry, and took part in the first rounds on the 12 after the Cathedral Evensong. He was supported by the President of the Central Council of Church Bell ringers, who himself had shared the tenor with the late Mr. Ferris Shepherd in the first peal ever rung on the Cathedral bells. The climax came with the ringing of the first courses of Grandsire and Stedman Cinques ever rung in Devon on tower bells.

Reports of Local Branches.

EXETER BRANCH.

The third year's report of our Exeter and district area indicates a very remarkable advance over the previous years.

The progress is shown in each phase of the Guild's work:—Expansion can be reported in the number of members, now 37 Hon. 1 Life, 94 Performing Members, and 71 Associates, with 6 New Bands added: also in the efforts put forth to train these new Societies—which, in some cases, are in distant and out-of-the-way places.

Our finances are also most encouraging showing an increase of over 50% to the General Funds, and still leaving the Branch a substantial balance in hand for extension work.

There has never been so much interest or enthusiasm shown in the country districts as now and during the past winter—each Band being keenly interested in visiting adjacent Towers to help one another.

Quarterly meetings have been held at Thorverton, Otterton, Honiton Clyst and Exeter (St. David's), the latter being the Annual Meeting of the Branch, when 100 sat down to tea (provided from the Branch Funds).

The Business Meeting followed, when enthusiasm was expressed and a hearty welcome extended to Rev. Maitland Kelly (President), Rev. E. S. Powell (Gen. Sec.), the Ven. Archdeacon of Exeter, also many other Clergyman and visiting Ringers.

Peal ringing has not shown the same satisfactory results as anticipated, but the three obtained (at Heavitree, Withycombe and Thorverton), record some "striking" of a very high order.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

All the bands in union report good progress. Sunday service ringing and practices have alike been well attended. At Ottery St. Mary 2 quarter peals have been rung and 4 members of the band with 4 from Exeter rang a peal on the recently re-hung Sidmouth bells. In addition to the Grandsire progress a good grip has been obtained of Stedman Triples, and it is hoped that the coming year will witness at least a quarter peal in this method as well as a peal of Grandsire by the local band. The newly-elected band at

Honiton has made notable advance in half-pull, and has succeeded in scoring a quarter peal, the greatest length ever rung on the bells. The Colyton ringers consist of a young band, whose members have learnt to handle their ropes excellently during the past year. They are now ready to start half-pull, and are only waiting repairs to the tower to put the bells in condition for them to do so. The enthusiastic band at Buckerell continues its satisfactory progress. The Sidmouth ringers, stimulated by the re-hanging of their bells, are looking forward eagerly to start half-pull under the tuition of instructors appointed by the Guild. Altogether the revival of change-ringing in this Branch is most encouraging.

NORTH EAST DEVON BRANCH.

The distinctive note from all the towers in union is one of progress in one way or another. The Stedman method has been practised consistently at Calverleigh, Tiverton and Washfield with success, while a start with Minor ringing has been made at Calverleigh. Bampton and Bickleigh have been engaged in giving instruction to probationers, and this should augur well for the near future. Huntsham, after doing very well, have sustained a temporary setback by the loss from the ringing chamber of Mr. Walter Goff, an old member of the Guild, through illness. Holcombe Rogus have a large number of ringers for a six-bell tower and are looking forward to advancing beyond Grandsire. It is good to learn that Calverleigh have been helping to initiate Stoodleigh in the art. Regular Sunday service ringing is reported from Bampton (latterly), Calverleigh, Huntsham, Tiverton and Washfield. Membership remains at much the same number and the funds show a substantial balance. The President of the Guild again attended the Annual Meeting held at Bickleigh, and once more urged members to aim at tackling the more difficult methods. It was decided towards the end of the year that practices for Bob Minor should be arranged. Quarterly meetings have been held with an average attendance of 48. It is gratifying to record that quarter-peals of Grandsire Triples have been scored by both the lady ringers at Tiverton, where ringers from Milverton who have been working in the neighbourhood have been giving useful assistance.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

At Ilfracombe the difficulties caused by the loss of two old members have been overcome by the excellent progress of two learners in Grandsire Triples. Visiting ringers have been somewhat numerous and three quarter-peals of Grandsire Triples have been rung. Mr. A. H. Hayward undertook the instruction of the

Combe Martin ringers on handbells during the winter. On July 26th the tower's bells, re-hung and increased to 8, were dedicated and progress was so rapid that on August 21st the first six score Grandsire Doubles by the local band was rung on tower bells, and later in the year a quarter-peal of Grandsire Doubles was brought round successfully in 49 minutes with 4-6-8 covering. All the members of the band have gained their Guild certificates.

MID-DEVON BRANCH.

Since the last Annual Meeting held at Paignton, two very successful meetings have been held at Dawlish and Newton Abbot when we had the great pleasure of the presence of our worthy President with us. Three Life and two Performing Members have been elected, one of the latter has been awarded the "Certificate." Several $\frac{1}{4}$ peals have been rung, three of which were conducted by Mr. Lilley (St. Chads), Mr. Henry Beams (Bridport), and Mr. W. T. Jefferies (Kent). One peal of Grandsire Triples has been rung at Babbacombe, with the assistance of Mr. E. Shepherd, conductor, Mr. J. C. Oke, and Mr. A. L. Bennett. Five of the Paignton band took part including Mrs. Gover, who rang a good bell, and scored at "first attempt."

Several combined practices have been held, and well-attended. A word of praise is due to Mr. Gover for securing the use of the towers of St. Mary Church, Upton and Babbacombe, and we are hopefully looking forward to a further development of the Branch which is most essential.

Several ringers in Torquay have recently been elected members and there is every prospect of a change ringing band materialising in the town during the coming year. At Paignton a beginning has been made with Stedman in addition to the excellent progress in Grandsire, but has been interrupted by sickness in the neighbourhood. The Cockington ringers report very good progress in Grandsire Triples. Sunday ringing has been well maintained.

The credit balance in the hands of the local Secretary is smaller than last year owing to some outstanding subscriptions.

SOUTH WEST BRANCH.

Considerable progress has been made by this Branch during the past year, and instruction to young ringers has been the predominating feature. The band at Kelly has taken on the instruction at Lew Trenchard, and it is hoped before long to welcome this band into the Guild.

Quite a number of young ringers have advanced to higher methods and Stedman, Treble Bob and Double Norwich are regularly rung at the practices.

Seven peals have been rung, and the Holbeton ringers are to be congratulated on ringing their peals of Bob Minor by their parochial band.

A pleasant feature is the number of new conductors coming to the front.

Only one meeting has been held during the year, difficulty having been experienced in arranging representative meetings in this scattered area.

The Plymouth meeting was a great success and afforded the members an opportunity of congratulating our President, the Rev. Maitland Kelly on reaching his 80th birthday.

At this meeting also we were pleased to welcome the Rev. H. H. Matthew, Vicar of St. Andrew's, into the Guild.

Regularity of Sunday ringing and for Festivals is reported by all the bands.

We are delighted that the Charles band has been reformed and appear once more among our bands in Union. Mr. W. Hornbrook has taken on the leadership and we congratulate him on calling his first peals.

The Kelly band reports progress in Bob Minor and rings regularly for Sunday service.

The Holbeton band continues its strong career, and is now taking up Treble Bob Minor.

The Emmanuel band rings regularly for Sunday service, and, with outside help, has scored many quarter-peals for Sunday service.

The St. Andrew's band has a number of recruits, and young Tom Myers is to be congratulated on ringing his first peal at the early age of 15.

The balance sheet for the year shows a credit balance of £3 19s 0d.

We can now say that we are on a good financial basis and perhaps during the coming year we may be able to offer assistance to members attending meetings from remote quarters.

In conclusion we beg to thank all the clergy and laymen who have taken an interest in our work, and look forward to a still more successful year, with a continued increase in membership of the Bands in Union.
