Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

O LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals; praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O LORD, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

- I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects: The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell Ringers for their sacred office; Belfry reform; and the cultivation of Change ringing.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members, Performing Members, and Associates; and the Bishop of the Diocese, being a Member, shall always be Patron.
- III. That duly qualified Members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild if proposed by a Member and approved by the Committee (hereafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and Branch Committees have also power to elect Members at any Committee meetings; and that no election be complete until the first Subscription be paid.
- IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member. Each Performing Member and Associate, who is attached to a Band in Union and each Unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild; but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a Changing Tower Bell in a touch of 120 Changes.
Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 Changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.
Associates shall have the privilege of being taught Change ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members; such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the Associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.
- V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5. Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on the payment of 5/-.
No Life Member will receive any pecuniary assistance, or notices, from the Guild unless he is specially employed.
- VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the Members present shall elect from either the Honorary Members or the Performing Members: A President; not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons who, being members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents) Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);—who, with five persons elected from the Honorary Members together with one Representative of each Band in Union and the Chairmen and Secretaries of local Branches, shall form the General Committee of Management; of whom three shall form a

quorum ; the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a Deputy (who must belong to his own Branch and be a Member). If a Representative Member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must belong to his own Band and be a Member).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meetings, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st June in each year ; and shall also arrange from time to time for United Practice Meetings of the Guild.
- VIII. That all Subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No Member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until the arrears be paid.
- IX. That the expenses incurred by Members (not being Life Performing Members) in attending Ringing Meetings arranged by the General Committee may, when the funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.
- X. That the ordinary Times of Practice of each Band in Union be stated in the Annual Report.
- XI. That Bands in Union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals if required to do so by the Incumbent of the Parish.
- XII. That no Member shall take part in any Ringing Match for a prize ; should he do so, he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.
- XIII. That no Member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any Band in Union with the Guild or upon any Member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.
- XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches shall only be made at an Annual or a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose.



RULES for LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer) and one Member from each Belfry in the Branch. The Incumbents of the Parishes forming the Branch (if Members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of Members, and Reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual Bands for the past year. He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of Honorary Members collected by him), retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch Accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of Members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch Officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect Members of the Guild and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the Local Chairman and Local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its Members attending Branch Meetings as is given the General Committee in Guild Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its Members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

THE great event of the year has been the Jubilee of the Guild, and opportunity was taken to commemorate it on the occasion of the annual gathering at Exeter on Whit-Monday.

The President of the Central Council (Rev. Canon Coleridge) preached at the Guild Service in the Cathedral to more than 300 members. Dinner was afterwards served at Deller's Cafe.

To the sincere regret of all, the President (Rev. Maitland Kelly) announced at the subsequent business meeting that owing to age and infirmity he was compelled to resign the office which he had held for 28 years,—and it is not too much to say that the Guild has lost a staunch and remarkable leader.

The Guild offers to his successor, the Rev. E. S. Powell, a hearty welcome to the Presidency, and its best wishes for his work.

Mr W. J. Southwood has generously presented a 'Corona' type-writer to the Guild as a Jubilee gift.

One of the outstanding achievements of this Jubilee year has been the 720 Cambridge Surprise Minor, which was rung for the first time by residents in Devon, members of the South-West Branch. The Committee would like to urge the more advanced and old-established bands to practise the higher methods, even though it may mean for the while rather fewer attempts for peals in the easier methods.

The inauguration of fraternal gatherings by the Exeter Branch is a move in the right direction, and the subjects which have been discussed cannot fail to forward some of objects for which the Guild exists.

The reports from the Branches show an addition of 8 new Bands during the year, making the total 52.

The need of an Instructor in the East Devon district seems to be militating against the extension of change-ringing, and associate bands are consequently being left uninstructed.

The Guild practices at the Cathedral have not been as fruitful as had been expected, but, given full attendances and wider support, a peal of Cinques ought soon to be recorded.

An illuminated album, containing a suitable address and a photograph of every Tower whose band is in union with the Guild, was presented to the Rev. Maitland Kelly on Dec. 5th, by the members, in recognition of his valuable services.

Twelve peals have been rung during the year, and all in the Grandsire method.

The finances of the Guild and its branches are in a satisfactory state, as will be seen from the accounts which appear at the end of this Annual Report.



REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

EXETER BRANCH.

WE are again able to report considerable progress.

The Honorary Members have increased from 49 to 52, and the total number of Performing Members from 182 to 228. Five new Bands have been affiliated during the year.

The state of our finances is also good, and £2 16s more than last year has been contributed to the General Fund,—still leaving a good balance in hand.

Quarterly meetings have been held at Alphington (70 present); Christow (80 present); and Woodbury (60 present); and as a result of the latter, the local Band was affiliated.

At the annual meeting, at St Thomas (140 present) on Dec 6th, a report was given of the presentation of a memorial album to the Rev M. Kelly, the late President.

Eleven peals have been rung during the year, one of Grandsire Caters and ten of Triples; and although of no particular merit, they have been the means of 14 members attaining their 'First Peal' distinction. In two cases, Chudleigh and Launceston, it was the first peal on the bells.

One of the oldest members of the Guild, Mr H. Payne, formerly of Huntsham, died during the year, and six of our members attended his funeral at Ide, on June 14th.

We have lost two valued honorary members, by the death of the Rev F. Jones, of St Sidwell's, Exeter, and the Rev Preb. Smith-Dorrien of Crediton.

Through the agency of the Guild, Exminster bells have been rung in a new iron frame, and the tenor bell re-cast.

Our Committee has been compelled, with much regret, to accept the resignation of Mr Southwood as Secretary and Treasurer of this Branch, owing to ill health; and they desire to place on record their appreciation of the inestimable service he has rendered during the five years he has held office.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

THERE is a marked improvement in change-ringing throughout this Branch.

The meeting, held at Seaton on Easter Monday, was well attended, and the ringing at the various towers was good.

The autumn meeting took place at Ottery St Mary. Nearly 60 members attended, and after the service, at which an address was given by the Rev L. B. Stallard, tea was provided at the Institute.

The Buckereil Band continues change-ringing satisfactorily; and

the Cotleigh ringers are quite enthusiastic, and have applied for tuition; as have also the Payhembury band.

Sidbury have now joined the Guild.

Talaton have made good progress with half-pull ringing, and can now ring a six-score of Grandsire Doubles.

The Ottery band, after the loss of two Stedman ringers, is advancing in a favourable manner, and with the aid of the President, rang a quarter peal of Stedman Triples.

NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

DURING the year this Branch has added two towers, Stoodleigh and Uplowman, to its numbers, making nine towers in all, with a membership of 74 performing members, of which all but 5 have already gained certificates.

The quarterly meetings were held at Stoodleigh, Bampton, Halberton, and Tiverton, with an average attendance of 51.

The President and the General Secretary of the Guild were present at the December meeting, and the Branch much appreciated Mr Powell's visits to several towers in connection with that event.

Bickleigh has had a hard struggle lately, and has felt the loss of Mr Vowler and others keenly, but has now a few learners nearly ready to receive certificates.

Stoodleigh and Uplowman find it hard to make much progress.

Calverleigh has done splendidly during the year, and has rung many 120's of Stedman Doubles and Bob Minor. Three certificates have been awarded, and many young ringers are coming on.

Holcombe Rogus is to be congratulated on the return of Mr Wilfred Wright. Mr Charles Webber and Mr Harry Berry have been married, and we extend to them our hearty good wishes for the future. Mr Bert Woodbury has taken up the captaincy of the band, on Mr Edward's resignation.

Huntsham band includes two youthful ringers in L. Kelland and T. Bowerman, aged 14 and 15 respectively. The former has already got his certificate.

Silverton band has zealously attended practices, and good progress has been made in the tower and on the handbells also, and some members will soon qualify for certificates. We hope the band will soon join the Guild. Our thanks are due to Messrs Ridler and Pook, of Thorverton, and Mr J. Baker, of Bickleigh, for help given on practice nights.

Bampton has a strong and energetic band. Since the re-opening of the bells at Tiverton, both Sunday ringing and practices have been well supported. Several quarter-peals of Grandsire Triples have been rung, including one muffled quarter-peal on the occasion of the death

of Mr J. Lock. Good progress has been made in Stedman, and regular help has been given to Bickleigh by members of the Branch.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

STEADY progress is being made at Ilfracombe with Grandsire Triples, and one member rang his first quarter-peal with our new President, Rev E. S. Powell, when he paid a visit to this Branch in October. Another quarter-peal has also been rung.

Visitors during the season were frequent. A ringer has come to reside in the town from Wales, and will fill the gap caused by one of the band leaving the town. There are also two probationers under instruction.

At Combe Martin, progress in Grandsire Triples is slow but sure. The extent of Grandsire Minor has been rung. One new member has been enrolled, and is now qualified for the Guild certificate; whilst two other probationers are learning. So there is cause for much satisfaction, seeing that this is all the outcome of only two years' work.

MID-DEVON BRANCH.

SINCE the last annual meeting, three very successful quarterly meetings have been held—at Stoke Gabriel, Totnes and Dartington, and Ipplepen respectively; and some excellent ringing was done, thanks to the help of the various visitors, notably Mr T. W. Golding (London), Mr F. J. Stitch (Newport), Mr G. D. Higginbotham (Devizes), and Mr W. B. Cartwright (Birmingham).

Good Practice and regular Sunday Ringing have been maintained, and good work has been done at St Marychurch, thanks to the Vicar, and also to Mr F. T. Luxton, who arranged the practices. One peal of Grandsire Triples has been rung at St Marychurch, thanks to the help of three Exeter members and our President.

Several quarter-peals of Triples have been rung at Paignton, two of which were conducted by two of the Band for the first time.

One life-member, two hon. members, and two associate members were elected during the year.

One quarter-peal of Grandsire Doubles was rung at Collaton St Mary by the Paignton Band.

SOUTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

THREE meetings were held during the year, and all were well attended. There has been a steady increase in the membership of the bands, and also in the number of honorary members.

One peal of Grandsire Caters was rung by a mixed band. This was the first peal, as conductor of Caters, by Mr W. Hornbrook, and

the first peal of Caters for three others.

Steady progress is being made in the Standard methods, and an effort made to introduce Change-ringing and the objects of the Guild in the Plympton district. Three Plympton men have qualified, and we hope that during the coming year a band will become affiliated to the Guild.

The visits of members from other branches has been a pleasing feature of our meetings.

A record for Devon was created on Dec 26th when six members of the Branch rang at Holbeton the first 720 Cambridge Surprise Minor ever rung in Devon by residents.

We regret the loss which the Branch has sustained by the death of the Rev H. H. Matthew, the late Vicar of St Andrew's.

The Kelly Band are strong in numbers, ring regularly on Sundays and Festivals, and, with the help of the President, scored their first 720 Bob Minor.

The St Andrew's Band are making capital progress. Several have qualified for certificates, while others are advancing to the higher methods of Stedman and Treble Bob.

The Emmanuel Band reports excellent progress. The Vicar is learning to ring, and two of the members of the congregation have become Hon. Members. Regular Sunday ringing is reported, and several quarter-peals have been rung for Service.

The Charles Band ring regularly for Sunday services, and tender thanks to other members who have so kindly assisted them. They have vacancies for young ringers who wish to learn.

The Holbeton Band ring regularly for Sunday services (Bob minor and Grandsire), and a beginning has been made with Treble Bob.

We again tender our thanks to the Clergy for their continued support, and to our President for his visits to the towers of bands in union, and for the help which he has given.
