Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

O LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

- I. THAT this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—
The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell Ringers for their sacred office.
Belfry Reform; and
The cultivation of Change Ringing.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.
- III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.
- IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes
Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.
Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.
Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.
- V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.
Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-.
No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.
- VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—
A President.
Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdea-

cons, who, being members, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents) Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, and the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, shall form the General Committee of Management;—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.

VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.

X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI. The bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.

XII. That no member shall take part in any ringing match for prizes; should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.

XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.

XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

REPORT of the GENERAL COMMITTEE.

THE year 1925 has again been a period of steady advance by the Guild, not so much in extension of its influence, as in making good on existing ground.

A total of 61 Certificates have been issued to performing members who have qualified. This shows that the system of organised instruction is having good results.

At the annual meeting at Plymouth on Whit-Monday, a change in the office of Secretary became inevitable, the Rev. E. V. Cox having to retire owing to his numerous parochial duties; and Mr. T. Laver was elected as his successor.

Reports from Branches show an addition of 4 new bands during the year, making the total 56, and there is evidence of great activity towards a higher and more conscientious standard.

The Guild practices at the Cathedral have been regularly kept up, with the result that an excellent quarter-peal of Grandsire Cinques was rung there on November 14th; and, although not strictly within the year under review, a peal of 5015 changes was brought round on January 9th 1926, the first by Devonshire men, and composed and conducted by our esteemed President, to whose initiative and perseverance much of the success of this crowning achievement must be attributed.

Our Peals Record comprises two of Grandsire Caters, seven of Grandsire Triples, three of Stedman Triples, and one of Kent Treble Bob Major; this latter being the first by a local band for sixteen years.

The finances of the Guild and its Branches continue in a satisfactory state as may be seen by reference to the accounts at the end of this Report.

REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

EXETER BRANCH.

ALTHOUGH we cannot report much increase in numbers, it is nevertheless a fact that a higher standard of method-ringing has been attained; some of the six-bell bands can now ring Stedman and Bob Minor fairly well.

Our total of Honorary Members is 52, as last year; Performing Members 234, an increase of 3; and 2 new bands have been affiliated—Aylesbeare and Lypmstone.

Our finances have kept up, with the result that we have been able to extend the instruction of young members, the fruits of which are already apparent.

Quarterly meetings have been held at Exminster (61 present), Crediton (46 present), and Exeter St. Sidwell's (132 present). A gratifying feature of the last meeting was the number of clergy who attended.

A quarter-peal of Grandsire Triples by railway-men members of the Guild was rung at St. David's Exeter, on Sunday Nov. 8th.

Eight peals have been rung during the year: 4 of Grandsire Triples, 3 of Stedman Triples, and 1 of Kent Treble Bob Major.

The bells of Upton Pyne have been restored, and the band there is making good progress.

A change had to be made in the office of Secretary and Treasurer owing to Mr. Laver's election as General Secretary, and at our annual meeting, Mr. J. C. Oke, who has ably acted as Assistant Secretary for the last five years, was elected to the office.

The Branch tender their acknowledgments to Mr. W. J. Southwood for the use of his showroom for committee meetings, and to Miss G. Davey for secretarial assistance.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

DURING the year there has been a further improvement in change-ringing generally throughout the Branch.

The annual meeting at Branscombe on Easter Monday was the first Guild meeting in the parish, and was well attended, over 50 being present at the tea; and it is believed good results will ensue.

At the autumn meeting, at Payhembury, an excellent address on the advantages of method-ringing was given by the Rev. G. E. F. Molineux.

The Buckerell band are steadily progressing, although they have lost a proficient member in R. Wilmington (representative). They are bringing on several young members.

Colyton bells have been overhauled and two of them quarter-turned. They are now in good order, and excellent striking is done by the band.

Honiton band, having mastered Grandsire, are now concentrating on Stedman and hope soon to score a quarter-peal in this method.

Although the Ottery band frequently ring touches of over 500 of Stedman Triples, they have not been able to ring a quarter-peal without outside help, but it is now practically assured they will be able to do so during the coming year.

Sidbury bells, having been overhauled and put in good order by Messrs. Taylor & Co., have been re-opened, after several months' silence.

Talaton band has done well with Grandsire, and now Mr. Betts has kindly arranged to give a course of instruction, they hope to make further progress.

Considering the small amount of help that has been given them, bands generally have done remarkably well.

NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

PROGRESS has been made during the year. Silvertown (now a fully qualified band) having joined the Guild, bringing the number of towers in this branch up to ten, with a total membership of 98 performing members (an increase of 24 on 1924), of whom 86 hold certificates, 7 are honorary members, and one unattached. Twelve new certificates have been awarded.

Quarterly meetings have been held, with an average attendance of 46, our visitors including Canon Coleridge, the Rev. M. Kelly, and the President and General Secretary of the Guild.

On April 25, the Ladies' Guild from Exeter and district were kindly entertained by Colonel Troyte at Huntsham Court, about 50 sitting down to tea.

By kind permission of the Rector, the Silvertown band have held practices at Bickleigh (Tiverton) while their own tower has been under repair. Excellent progress has been made by this new band, six having qualified, a tribute to the able tuition of the Rev. G. E. F. Molineux, and their own keenness.

At Uplowman the ringing is steadily improving, and two new members have been added to the band.

Stoodleigh, in spite of being isolated and having lost some old hands, resolutely keeps up its number.

Washfield has kept up Sunday ringing, and brought on one new member who has qualified.

Calverleigh is working hard on Bob Minor, and, thanks to a visit from the Rev. E. S. Powell, has made good headway in the method.

Bampton is ambitious, and hopes soon to ring Stedman as well as they do Grandsire.

At Tiverton, Sunday ringing and practices have been well maintained. A quarter-peal of Stedman Triples, conducted by Mr. J. Elsworthy, was rung, and three members took part in a peal of Grandsire Triples at Thorverton, conducted by Mr. Chamberlain of Cardiff.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

ILFRACOMBE band has lost two of its members by removal, but hope soon to bring on probationers to fill their places.

Visitors during the season have not been as numerous as usual.

At Combe Martin, Mr. Hayward has been busy with four learners, who give every promise of becoming qualified. It is hoped that the fruits of these efforts will become apparent next year.

MID DEVON BRANCH.

SINCE the last annual meeting three well attended quarterly meetings have been held—at Buckfastleigh (with Ashburton), Dartmouth, and Teignmouth; the latter being a great success thanks mainly to the support of members from other Branches.

We regret the resignation of Mr. H. W. Wilkes from the Chairmanship, a position he has held since 1921; but we were fortunate in finding an able successor in Mr. F. J. Laxton.

We are grateful to Mr. F. T. Gover for his constant and ever ready kindness in giving instruction at Cockington, Collaton, and Brixham.

A quarter-peal of Grandsire Doubles was rung at Cockington for the Vicar's wedding.

At Paignton, some good practices of Stedman have been held, but owing to the ill-health of several members, progress has been hindered.

A new band has just been formed at Higher Brixham, consisting of 15 eager young men, who have been visiting Paignton for instruction in handling the bells, and will soon be affiliated to the Guild.

Five Honorary and five Performing Members have been elected.

Our chief drawback is want of instructors, and it is much hoped that members who are capable will come forward to assist Mr. Gover, who on many occasions has put in four nights a week at this work.

SOUTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

THREE meetings of the Branch have been held—at Plympton, Revelstoke, and Bickleigh (Plymouth). As one result of these meetings the Plympton St. Maurice band is now affiliated, and are to be congratulated on their remarkable proficiency under the tuition of Mr. W. Wonnacott, seven members having qualified for certificates.

Members of the Bickleigh band are attending practices at Emmanuel, and we hope a change-ringing band from that tower will soon become affiliated.

Three peals have been rung, one of Grandsire Caters at Charles—with bells half muffled, in memory of the late Queen Alexandra—and

two of Grandsire Triples.

The Bishop of Plymouth has granted the use of Stoke bells on Thursday evenings for practices in higher methods.

We regret the loss the Branch has sustained by the death of the Rev. W. D. Dowding of Ugborough.

Two members took part in the first quarter peal of Cinques by Devonshire men on the bells of Exeter Cathedral.

A representative band from the Branch rang a quarter peal of Grandsire Triples after the dedication of a new peal at Tavistock.

St. Andrew's bells have been silent for the greater part of the year, and are now in the bellhangers' hands.

Charles band are making capital progress, seven certificates having been granted to new ringers.

Emmanuel band ring regularly for Sunday services, and have scored several quarter-peals.

Kelly band can now ring Bob Minor, and two 720's have been rung during the year.

Holbeton band ring Bob Minor, and are learning Treble Bob.

Each band reports considerable advancement and increased membership. The aims and objects of the Guild regarding Sunday service ringing have been well carried out, and we have a good proportion of learners who are making splendid progress.
