IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*  
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

*Glory be to the Father, &c.*

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

## GUILD RULES.

- I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—  
The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-Ringers for their sacred office.  
Belfry Reform; and  
The cultivation of Change Ringing.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.
- III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.
- IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes.  
Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.  
Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.  
Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.
- V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.  
Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-  
No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.
- VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—  
A President.  
Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being members, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents).

Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, and the representatives on the Central Council, shall form the General Committee of Management:—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.
- VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.
- IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.
- X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.
- XI. The bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.
- XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing; should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.
- XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.
- XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

## RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

---

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.  

He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

## REPORT of the GENERAL COMMITTEE.

---

The year 1927 will be noteworthy for the record number of peals by resident members—thirty-four; compared with 1903, when out of a total of 37, twenty-eight were rung by resident members. The peal of Stedman Cinques at Exeter Cathedral on October 15th, rung chiefly by non-resident members, is notable as being the first in the method by members of this Guild, and is to be commemorated by a peal board presented by the Rev. M. Kelly, to be dedicated early in 1928.

This fine performance should be remembered as something worthy of emulation by Devonshire men.

In this connection the Committee must express their disappointment with the attendances at the monthly Cathedral practices, and it will be a cause for regret if these have to be abandoned.

There has been no expansion during the past year, one band having become affiliated, and another dropped out.

The Committee desire to call the attention of qualified members to the number of Associate bands affiliated (9 out of 60), and would urge on all who are able and willing, to do their share in the matter of instruction, a crying need in all districts. Grants for instruction expenses from the General Fund have unfortunately had to be reduced or delayed owing to a diminished balance, but it is hoped that a proposal for augmenting the General Fund by a levy from the Branches in respect of the Annual Report, which has been agreed by nearly all the Branches, will be favourably received at the Annual Meeting. In the meantime several of the Branches are loyally paying instructor's expenses from their own funds, an action which the Committee appreciates.

## REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

---

### EXETER BRANCH.

Judging from the reports received from representatives of Bands in Union, the past year has shown steady work, particularly in Sunday Service ringing. Practices have been well attended and Stedman, Plain Bob, and other methods have been studied.

Nine Peals have been rung by members, six in the Grandsire method, two of Stedman Triples, and one of Bob Major. It is noteworthy that these peals included thirteen first peals for members, and one first as Conductor. Both peals of Grandsire Doubles were the first on the bells, one at Exminster and the other at Spreyton, and the ringers included some of the younger members of this Branch.

Colaton Raleigh Band have mastered the first steps of Grandsire under the tuition of Littleham Band.

The Statement of Accounts shows a satisfactory balance, but a slight decrease in the number of performing members, caused by Aylesbeare Band having dropped out, owing to the emigration of several promising beginners. Hopes of reforming this Band are held out.

District Meetings were held at Broadclyst (65 present), Lypstone (50 present), and St. Davids, Exeter (110 present). The social aspect of these gatherings is of much value.

We regret the loss sustained in our Branch by the death of Mr. W. Acreman and Mr. F. Murphy, both active members of St. Sidwell's Band.

At the Annual Meeting we received with regret the resignation of Mr. E. Shepherd as chairman, after seven years devoted work. We shall do well to bear in mind his parting advice, to make "The cultivation of Change ringing our object and creed."

We welcome Rev. E. V. Cox as our new chairman, and look to him to lead us on to advance further.

### EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Steady endeavour to progress by the various Bands in this Branch has been a feature of the past year.

Sunday Service ringing and practices have been well maintained in all towers. The Annual Meeting at Sidmouth was well supported by local Bands, also the Autumn Meeting at Feniton, where the bells have since been restored.

Both the Branch and the Guild have sustained a great loss by the death on Aug. 17th, of Mr. W. E. Pitfield Chapple, who associated himself very closely with all ringing matters. Any addition to our list of honorary members would be heartily welcomed.

Ottery Band are now at full strength, and have been concentrating on Stedman, having rung a quarter peal and several long touches during the year. The seventh bell has been quarter turned, and other minor repairs carried out by Mr. Harry Stokes.

Honiton Band have lost their captain, Mr. W. Stuart, by death, after holding office for over twenty years, also G. Strawbridge, who has been obliged to give up owing to deformity. Two young men have been added in their stead, and are making good progress. Buckerell Band can ring Bob Minor, and Cotleigh and Sidbury are now practically all qualified. Talaton Band have rung several quarter peals of Grandsire Doubles, also a peal on May 14th, and are now practicing Stedman, with the help of Mr. Betts.

#### NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

We are pleased to report an increase of membership, having now nine honorary members, 102 performing members, and one unattached.

Eight certificates have been awarded, and two peals of Grandsire Doubles have been rung during the year, one at Bickleigh, conducted by Mr. F. Davey, and one at Silverton, also conducted by Mr. F. Davey, on January 29th, rung as a compliment to the Rev. G. E. F. Molineux on his election as chairman of the Branch. These peals were both first peals for the ringers in the Branch, and first on the bells.

Quarterly meetings have been held at Huntsham, Uplowman and Bampton, with an average attendance of 67.

Holcombe Rogus Band is very glad to welcome back Mr. Ernest Woodberry, who is to be re-elected at our next meeting, and has two learners coming on as well. Bampton Band is fortunate in having Mr. W. R. Scott with them again, and are to be congratulated on their two pupils. Bickleigh, Huntsham and Uplowman have young members coming on. Calverleigh Band is establishing itself in Minor ringing, and with the help of some of the Tiverton Band has accomplished some Kent Treble Bob, thanks to kind instruction by Messrs. Davey and Lethbridge from Exeter. Silverton Band much regrets the loss of two members, Mr. C. E. Yeo by death, and Mr. W. J. Brooks, who has left the district.

#### NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

A peal of Grandsire Triples, Holt's Original, was rung at Combe Martin on August 25th, conducted by Mr. W. J. Jeffries. Messrs. F. Smith and W. W. Stevens were elected life members before starting.

A special meeting was held at Ilfracombe on Sept. 28th, at which the President and Gen. Secretary were present, to consider what might be done in the way of propaganda work during the winter months.

It was decided to arrange for a meeting at Georgeham, to which the ringers of Braunton, Morteheo and Georgeham should be invited, with a view to ascertaining how many would like to learn half-pull ringing.

This meeting was subsequently held at Georgeham on Nov. 17th, but as the local ringers, who had been invited, did not respond, nothing further could be done.

During the year, Ilfracombe Band have scored many touches of over 500 changes of Grandsire Triples, and are steadily regaining lost ground. Combe Martin Band have been practising Bob Doubles and have rung several six-scores. Two young ladies can now ring rounds, but we are hindered by a deplorable lack of interest shown by some of our members.

#### MID-DEVON BRANCH.

During the year, Annual and Quarterly meetings have been held at Brixham, Bovey Tracey and Dartmouth, and were all successful, thanks to the assistance given by members of other Branches.

We regret the loss of two Honorary Members, the Rev. H. Heap having left the district, and Mr. S. O. Manlove, deceased. One new Honorary Member has been gained (Mrs. L. W. Browne), and Mr. H. W. Wilkes has been re-elected. St. Petrox, Dartmouth, have become affiliated as an associate band, and arrangements have been made for practices for them at Brixham. The Brixham Band scored their first quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles on Easter Sunday with the help of Mr. J. S. Collings from Paignton. Collaton Band are making good progress. Paignton have received visits from members of other County Associations, and several quarter peals of Triples have been rung. An attempt for a peal of Grandsire Triples unfortunately came to grief about half-way, and illness and accident have prevented another attempt. Arrangements were made for an attempt for a peal of Stedman Triples with the assistance of Mr. C. R. Walker, but this had to be abandoned, owing to sickness. Regular Sunday service and practice ringing is reported from all towers.

#### SOUTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

Meetings have been held at Shaugh, Aveton Gifford and Lifton. At the latter there was a record attendance, and six of the local ringers were presented with certificates by the President.

Even-bell ringing has been a feature of 1927; out of 21 peals rung, fourteen have been in even-bell methods—a record for the Branch.

The peal of Doubles at Lifton on Nov. 1st reflects great credit on this young band, who only joined during the year.

Practices at Stoke in higher methods have been well maintained, and several extents in Cambridge and London minor accomplished, with the result that striking has improved in methods generally.

We would again remind members that these are Branch practices open to all. The Vicar of Plympton St. Maurice has kindly granted permission for monthly practices in higher methods on the Thursday night on and after the 17th of each month. Will all members who wish to progress endeavour to attend.

Four attempts for quarterly peals, organised by the Branch Committee, have been made, and two were successful, both in even-bell methods, conducted by the Guild President.

Regularity of Sunday and Festival ringing is generally satisfactory, and those in charge of the various bands are not sparing in energy or patience to bring on new members.

The young band at St. Andrew's, as foreshadowed in 1926 Report, have accomplished a peal of Bob Royal, the first on the bells.

Plympton St. Maurice Band report continued progress, and some of the ringers at Plympton St. Mary are receiving instruction from Mr. W. Wonnacott, which we hope will eventually lead to their band being affiliated. Kelly Band still progress with Bob Minor, and with Mr. Powell's help, have been successful with three extents. Holbeton Band ring Bob Minor regularly, and are advancing with Treble Bob. Lifton Band have started Grandsire Triples, and with the encouragement of their Vicar and their own keenness, should soon be proficient.

The problem of instruction is ever before us, and we want volunteers for this work. The Rev. M. Kelly is doing his best at Tavistock, but we cannot expect him to carry on for long.

We appreciate the many visits of the Guild President to our practices, and thank him for his help, and offer our heartiest congratulations on his approaching marriage.

We regret that he is leaving our district, but our loss will be Exeter's gain.

We again tender our best thanks to our Incumbents and Honorary Members for their support, and assure them that their presence and advice at our meetings will inspire us to attain higher ideals, and act up to the standard of real Church workers.
