## Belfry Prayers.

*Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.*

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

O LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*  
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

*Glory be to the Father, &c.*

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

## GUILD RULES.

I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—  
The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-Ringers for their sacred office.

Belfry Reform; and

The cultivation of Change Ringing.

II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.

III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.

IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes.

Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.

Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.

Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.

V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.

Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-

No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being members, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents).

Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, and the representatives on the Central Council, shall form the General Committee of Management:—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.

VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.

X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI. The bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.

XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing; should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.

XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.

XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

## RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex officio members of the Branch Committee.

2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.

He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.

3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.

4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.

5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.

6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

## REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

---

The Guild has again passed through a year of steady progress, for while there have been no rapid strides worthy of comment, a general advance all round has been maintained. More attention has been given to the practice of even bell methods, so highly esteemed in the Northern and Eastern counties.

At the largely attended Annual Meeting at Barnstaple on Whit Monday a presentation was made to the President on the occasion of his marriage. It consisted of a gentleman's wardrobe and set of eight handbells, with a book containing the names of 418 subscribers, members of the Guild. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. M. Kelly, ex-President, who paid tribute to Mr. Powell's organizing ability and the success attending his scheme for dividing the Guild into district Branches. An account of the subscriptions and expenditure for the presentation appears on page 33 of this Report.

The total number of peals rung—twenty-seven—although not so many as during the previous year, includes a greater variety of methods, and in that respect may be considered to be an advance.

A scheme for a levy from the Branches to the General Fund towards the cost of production of this Report was approved at the Annual Meeting, and will be carried into effect with this issue. The statement of accounts for the year shows an increased balance, which is deemed satisfactory.

## REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

---

### EXETER BRANCH.

We regret that two of our Associate Bands have resigned, owing to difficulties in keeping their numbers together, but the election of new members into other Bands has almost compensated for the defection.

Much the same has occurred amongst the Honorary Members through removals, the result of which is that the membership is slightly reduced. Two Honorary Members have passed away, H. B. Kindersley, Esq. and Mr. W. Heppell; and two performing members, Messrs. W. H. Glass and J. Vanstone, both of whom had been members for many years, have joined the great majority. We have elected two more Life Members and one Unattached performing member.

Nine peals have been rung, 1 Stedman Caters, 3 Stedman Triples, 3 Grandsire Triples, 1 Bob Minor and 1 Grandsire Doubles.

One of Grandsire Triples was the first to be conducted by Mr. W. S. Lethbridge. Mr. E. Shepherd conducted four of the others, Mr. E. W. Biffin two, and Rev. E. S. Powell and Mr. F. J. Davey one each.

A peal board, presented by the Rev. Maitland Kelly, was unveiled in the Cathedral Belfry on February 11th, to record a peal of Stedman Cinques rung by members of the Guild.

Meetings have been held at Thorverton—64 present, Colaton Raleigh—64, and St. Thomas, Exeter—100. We now adopt the plan of blending the bands at these meetings, and thus enable those less skilled to profit by some practice with others who know the methods better. A feature at the end of the year was a determined attempt to master some of the even bell methods, and special practices were arranged at Clyst St. George, St. Petrock, Exeter. Exminster and Newton St. Cyres, covering a period of three months. We gratefully acknowledge the able assistance of the President and Mrs. Powell, and our Chairman (Rev. E. V. Cox), under whose tuition considerable progress was made, and the large attendances showed the keen interest aroused. Considerable progress in Bob Minor has also been made at Sowton. The finances of the Branch are in good condition, and we are able to add to our balance, which addition will no doubt be expended on further tuition. At the Annual Meeting Mr. T. J. Stokes, through pressure of other work, was compelled to retire from the post of Hon. Secretary and Treasurer, a decision which was received with regret, but the duties of the office will be carried on by Miss E. Lomas of Whimple.

#### EAST DEVON BRANCH.

During the year meetings have been held at Sidbury, Ottery St. Mary and Honiton, and were all well attended, visiting members from other branches, who are always welcome, being present.

The meeting at Ottery St. Mary attracted a record attendance, nearly 100 members and visitors. The Ottery St. Mary band maintains its strength, and keep up their regular practices.

Talaton band is making good progress with Stedman Doubles, and is learning Bob Minor, and hope to be able soon to ring a 720. Eight certificates have been awarded to members in the branch. The monthly practices in even bell methods are being continued at Ottery St. Mary on the first Monday in each month at 7 p.m., and ringers who can come over and help us will be most welcome.

#### NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Our Membership has slightly decreased, owing to the resignation of Bradninch band, and we have now eight Honorary Members 89 performing members and two unattached.

Three certificates have been awarded. Quarterly meetings have been held at Holcombe Rogus, Calverleigh, Hemyock and Tiverton, with an average attendance of 52.

Sunday service ringing is reported generally from all bands. Washfield band rang a quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles on Armistice Day and good progress is being made with Bob Minor.

Silverton band also rang a quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles on Oct. 27, Mr. Selley's first as conductor, and are tackling Bob Minor in earnest. Holcombe Rogus band have lost two useful members, who, it is hoped will not altogether desert the ringing chamber. They visited Bristol for their annual outing.

Calverleigh band has lost a useful member in Ernest Green, but are teaching two others, and making some headway with Bob Minor. A peal of Bob Minor was rung at Calverleigh in October conducted by the President, Mr. J. T. Woodley ringing the treble.

Bampton, Tiverton and Uplowman are all teaching learners.

Some of the Tiverton band have attended the even bell practices at Calverleigh, Silverton and Washfield.

The Branch is much indebted to the President and Mrs. Powell, also Messrs. Davey and Lethbridge, for their kind assistance with even bell methods, and we thank all the visitors who have attended our quarterly meetings, thereby adding so much to their success.

#### NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

Iffracombe band has suffered the loss of two old and esteemed members, Mr. F. Reed by death, and Mr. R. Dadds, their representative for many years, by resignation owing to deafness and failing energy. One probationer is learning well, and it is hoped he will be qualified by Easter.

Combe Martin band has attained some proficiency in Bob Doubles, and a quarter peal in the method, also in Grandsire Doubles, have been rung. One probationer can ring the treble through Grandsire Triples, and it is hoped during the coming year to recover some of the lost ground. On Friday, Aug. 17th, in Combe Martin tower, a peal board recording the peal of Grandsire Triples rung on Aug. 25th, 1927, the gift of the conductor, Mr. W. J. Jeffries, was unveiled by the Rector, who said he hoped it would be an incitement to his own band to emulate the performance. One new band, Marland St. Peter, have become affiliated, and have been visited by the Branch Secretary, who reports satisfactory progress.

#### MID-DEVON BRANCH.

During the year meetings have been held at Totnes, Collaton St. Mary, Lustleigh, Churston Ferrers and Brixham, all except Lustleigh being well attended. Regular Sunday ringing and practices have been maintained except at Littlehempstone where the bells are in the bellhanger's hands.

Several quarter peals have been rung at Paignton, Collaton and Brixham, also a peal of Grandsire Triples at Paignton, the first on the bells. Our thanks are due to Mr. E. W. Marsh for conducting and to Messrs. Bennett and Walker for taking the places of local members who were indisposed.

Good progress has been made at Collaton with Bob Doubles, and Paignton has persevered with Stedman Doubles.

At Churston Ferrers the bells have been perfectly restored, augmented to six, and rehung. A young band has been formed and efforts made to get them to join the Guild. Four members have joined and are being taught.

Two Honorary and five Associate members have been elected whilst one Honorary and three Performing members have resigned.

## SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

The Lord Bishop of Plymouth presided at our Annual Meeting at Holbeton, also acted as host at the Spring meeting at Stoke, and we are grateful for his kind interest and influence.

A notable feature has been the advance in even bell ringing following the special practices at Stoke, which culminated in the first peal of Cambridge Surprise Minor by the Guild at Holbeton on March 3rd. A tablet, engraved by Mr. Hiscott, recording the peal has been erected in the tower.

Another peal in the same method was rung at Charles Church on March 12th. Kelly Band are to be congratulated on scoring their first peal of Bob Minor.

A ringing week in Devon and Cornwall in August organised by the Branch Secretary and Mr. F. Bennett of Brighton, resulted in five peals being rung out of eight attempts. The visitors highly appreciated being allowed to ring the Exeter Cathedral bells.

It is hoped to organise a similar tour next summer, and in that way give some encouragement to younger members in enabling them to accomplish their first peals.

Captains of bands have given ungrudgingly time and energy in instruction and propaganda, and with their continued enthusiasm and the support of the clergy we hope at the end of 1929 to report even more progress.
