Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

- I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—
The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-Ringers for their sacred office.
Belfry Reform; and
The cultivation of Change Ringing.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.
- III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.
- IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes.
Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.
Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.
Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.
- V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.
Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-
No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.
- VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—
A President.
Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being members, shall be ex officio Vice-Presidents).

Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, and the representatives on the Central Council, shall form the General Committee of Management:—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the 1st of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.
- VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.
- IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.
- X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.
- XI. The bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.
- XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing; should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.
- XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.
- XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

In Memoriam.

Before commencing the Annual Report on the general work of the Guild, the Committee have to express their deep sorrow at the loss the Guild has sustained by the death of the Rev. Maitland Kelly, who held the Offices of Honorary Secretary from 1890 to 1896, and President from 1896 to 1924.

Mr. Kelly's enthusiasm for and devotion to all the interests of the Guild will never be forgotten by the older members, and it would be impossible in a brief eulogy, to describe the extent of his work, and how much he endeared himself to his fellow members by his kindly sympathy and help.

The President and General Secretary attended the funeral at Kelly on June 19th, and laid a wreath on the grave as a tribute of respect from the Guild.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE

A particularly encouraging feature of the year has been the attendance and interest shown at the many meetings which have been held.

From the reports received from the various Branches it would appear that the Guild generally has been marking time during the year 1929, and has not made such advance as might be expected to keep pace with the times. Only fifteen peals have been rung, compared with twenty-seven in 1928. While peal ringing is not the sole aim of the Guild, it is undoubtedly an index of progress, and this falling off, together with a decline in membership, are factors that give the Committee some anxiety. The Committee desire to impress on all members that the Guild is a live organisation, and as such it must be either progressive or retrograde. Every single member can do something to help forward the work, but if any are apathetic then the burden laid on the officers to carry on the organisation is unduly increased.

The monthly Cathedral practices have been sadly neglected, and the Committee would urge all, who can, to attend these practices to acquire an insight into twelve-bell work.

REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

EXETER BRANCH.

Steady progress has been maintained during the year.

Thanks to the untiring energy of our President and Mrs. Powell, Minor practices have been held at various towers, and a few silent practices for Double Norwich at St. David's.

Members of the Branch have taken part in nine peals, two each of Grandsire Triples, Bob Major, and Bob Minor, and one each of Grandsire Doubles, Stedman Triples, and Grandsire Caters.

We congratulate Mrs. Powell on being the first lady to conduct a peal for the Guild at Moretonhampstead on Aug. 31st.

The majority of our bands in union in the Branch rang half-muffled touches on the occasion of the funeral of our late esteemed President, the Rev. Maitland Kelly.

We regret that during the year Mr. E. M. Sargent, of St. Sidwell's band, has passed away.

Our membership has fallen slightly owing chiefly to Woodbury and Exminster bands having resigned, but, on the other hand, several new members, both Performing and Honorary, have been elected, and a new band has been affiliated at Bridgerule, where considerable progress has been made in a short time. Well attended meetings have been held at Newton St. Cyres, Kenn, and St. Sidwell's, Exeter.

Fifteen change ringing Certificates have been awarded during the year.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

This Branch has held three meetings during the year, all of which have been well attended. The loss of six Honorary Members, and withdrawal of Colyton and Payhembury bands, are temporary set-backs, which we hope to regain during the coming year. The Ottery St. Mary band has lost two keen members in Percy and Henry Godfrey, both good inside ringers whom it will be difficult to replace, as there seems a lack of interest in ringing among the young men in the district. Honiton and Sidbury bands, however, have maintained their full strength, and can ring Grandsire and Stedman Doubles with precision. Talaton band has been unfortunate, after making good progress with Stedman Doubles and Bob Minor; in July they were obliged to suspend ringing owing to a crack having developed in the tower. It is hoped something will soon be done to keep the band together, as it would be a loss both to the Guild and the Parish if they were disbanded. Mr. C. Woodley, their leader, has removed to Sidmouth, and no doubt will be a great help to the band there.

We are indebted to the President and Mrs. Powell for their help in our even bell practices.

NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Quarterly Meetings have been held during the year at Bampton, Rackenford, Stoodleigh and Tiverton, and all have been well attended. The Branch has sustained a great loss by the resignation of Miss Hanson, as Hon. Secretary and Treasurer, and in recognition of her five years' work for the Branch, a presentation of a leather despatch case, suitably inscribed, was made to her at the Annual Meeting.

Sunday Service ringing has been well maintained. Tiverton band has lost one of their oldest members by the death of Mr. E. Munday. This band has scored several quarter peals of Grandsire Triples, with good striking. Holcombe Rogus band has lost Mr. H. Woodberry, their captain, but are bringing on three learners. Their ringing chamber has been lined with matchboarding, which makes it more comfortable. Washfield has lost a valued member in Sergt. W. Snell, R.N., who was killed in a gun explosion on H.M.S. Devonshire. Calverleigh are still practising Bob Minor.

Stoodleigh, although isolated, manage to keep up a full band, but would welcome assistance. Huntsham band are practising Stedman Doubles, and have several learners. An attempt for a peal of Grandsire Triples here on October 26th, in which Col. Troyte and Mr. T. Aldridge took part, unfortunately failed after 2 hrs. 40 mins. good ringing.

Practices in minor methods have been held at Silverton, and with the help of the President, Messrs. Davey and Lethbridge, and members of Tiverton band, two members got through their first peal of Bob Minor, and others had a good insight in the method. It is hoped that during the coming year members will make a special effort to extend the Branch, and bring in additional members.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

The Combe Martin band has added two new members during the year, D. Betts, who was elected at our Annual Meeting, and T. Yeo, who is qualified and will be elected at our next meeting.

We now hope to make some progress with eight-bell ringing, eight-bell practices having been the order during the winter months.

Ilfracombe band has experienced a trying time during the year, having lost two members by death, and three others have resigned. They are, however, regaining some of the lost ground by training recruits, three of whom have rung six-scores of Grandsire Doubles, which is satisfactory and sure progress.

At Peters Marland the band is plodding along steadily, one recruit being qualified. Unfortunately their leader, the Rev. W. H. Smale, will be leaving for an adjoining parish shortly, where, however, he hopes to be able to keep the band together.

MID-DEVON BRANCH.

During the year three meetings have been held, at Paignton, Staverton and Kingsteignton, which were fairly well attended, thanks to the help of other Branches.

A peal of Grandsire Triples was rung at Kingsteignton with the assistance of Mr. E. W. Marsh, and Mr. Walker is to be congratulated on conducting this, his first peal. A half peal of Grandsire Doubles has been rung by Collaton band unassisted and practically self-taught. Quarter peals have been rung at Brixham and Paignton. One life member (Mr. H. G. Lewis), and one associate member (F. M. Roberts), were elected at the Staverton meeting.

We regret the loss of three Honorary Members, Rev. L. W. Browne and Mrs. Browne, by removal, and Mr. C. Drew, deceased. The death of Mr. J. S. Collings was a loss to the Paignton band, he did invaluable work in helping the learners at Brixham. St. Petrox, Dartmouth, and the Littlehempstone bands have withdrawn, also the four associates from Churston Ferrers.

SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

Three meetings have been held, the Annual Meeting at Plympton, a Spring Meeting at Cornwood, and an Autumn Meeting at Tamerton. The first two were very sparsely attended, and did not merit the expenditure incurred.

Only two remain in the Guild from Holbeton, and three from Charles, but the latter band is being reformed, so we hope for increased membership this year.

The death of the Rev. Maitland Kelly was a great loss to the Branch, as he was a regular attendant at all our meetings. The Branch was represented at the funeral by the Chairman and Secretary, who took part in a 720 of Bob Minor, half-muffled, after the committal service. St. Andrew's band are strong, and can ring the four Standard methods excellently.

The younger members of Emmanuel band are making good progress. Plympton band has several keen members who are willing to instruct recruits when forthcoming. Lifton bells have been silent most of the year for rehangings; they are to be re-opened on Saturday, March 15th next. Kelly band can ring Bob Minor creditably. The practices in Surprise methods at Stoke are being continued regularly on Thursdays, and good progress is being made.
