## Belfry Prayers.

### BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

*Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.*

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

O LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*  
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

*Glory be to the Father, &c.*

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

## GUILD RULES.

I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—

The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-Ringers for their sacred office.

Belfry Reform; and

The cultivation of Change Ringing.

and that it be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.

III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.

IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes.

Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.

Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.

Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.

V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.

Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-

No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents).

Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer);— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, and the representatives on the Central Council, shall form the General Committee of Management:—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.
- VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.
- IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.
- X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.
- XI. The bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.
- XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing; should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.
- XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.
- XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

## RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.  
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

## REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

The past year may be regarded as a period of steady progress in the furtherance of the aims and objects of the Guild.

Although no material expansion can be recorded, much work has been done in the education of Associate Members, 46 certificates having been awarded to those qualified.

An event of special interest was the meeting of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers at Plymouth on Whit-Tuesday, the arrangements made for their reception by the Guild being much appreciated.

On the following day the Memorial to the late Rev. Maitland Kelly, to which the Guild had contributed, was dedicated by Canon Coleridge at a special service in Kelly Church.

Among the peals rung, the 5280 of Cambridge Surprise Maximus at Exeter Cathedral on October 15th is an outstanding feature, the performance being of the highest standard, and considered to be a record for merit and endurance. Although accomplished by all non-resident life members, the Committee desire to express their congratulations to the band on ringing such a magnificent peal.

The Committee have to deplore the loss by death of Mr. Frank Davey, an instructor appointed in 1898, whose efforts in promoting the interests of the Guild have been constant and widespread throughout his career.

The President and Gen. Secretary represented the Committee at the funeral at Exeter on Nov. 21st.

## REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

### EXETER BRANCH.

Well attended meetings have been held at Thorverton, Newton St. Cyres, Brampford Speke and St. Thomas, Exeter. Six new members were elected at the Thorverton meeting, thus forming a new band at Brampford Speke, instructed by the Rev. E. V. Cox.

At the Newton St. Cyres meeting some members visited Crediton, but found the bells in a bad state. Seven new members from Upton Pyne and one from St. David's, Exeter, were elected at this meeting. At Brampford Speke we were received by the Vicar, the Rev. E. V. Cox, a past Chairman of the Branch, who has had the bells tuned and rehung. Six certificates were presented to members of Upton Pyne Band. Great praise is due to the Rev. E. V. Cox for his efforts in the formation of this band, also to Mr. W. Richardson for the instruction given the learners at St. Petrock's, Exeter, on Thursday evenings, when he holds practices there for anyone who would like to have a pull. We have lost two members through death, Mr. Frank Davey and Mr. Reginald Ware.

Membership has been well maintained, strengthened by new members at Upton Pyne and Brampford Speke.

### AYLESBEARE DEANERY BRANCH.

Well attended meetings have been held during the year at Topsham, Littleham, Clyst St. George and Whimble, when Grandsire Stedman, Plain and Treble Bob have been the methods rung. At the suggestion of the Chairman, and in conjunction with the President, the officers of the Branch issued an invitation to the unattached towers in the Deanery to link up with the Guild. A possible sequel to this is the starting of change ringing at East Budleigh, though the ringers there have not yet joined the Guild.

The Withycombe Raleigh band have been making good progress in Kent Treble Bob Minor and Major, and at Clyst St. George, Bob Minor is being persevered with. One member of the latter band has succeeded in ringing his first peal of Bob Minor.

### EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Three meetings were held during the year, at Colyton, Luppitt and Honiton, with an average attendance of 55.

It is with regret we have to record the passing away of two of the oldest members of the Branch, Mr. W. Stoneman of Sidmouth, and Mr. J. Lovering of Ottery St. Mary, both tenor ringers.

The Branch as a whole is doing well, our total membership now being 85.

The Rev. L. B. Stallard, after eleven years service, resigned the office of Chairman at the Annual Meeting, and the Rev. J. F. Prowse was elected as his successor.

Talaton bells are now quite in order, having been restored and rehung by Messrs. Gillett and Johnson.

Luppitt band is still making good progress and is now proficient in ringing the Stedman method.

Payhembury band is strong in number, and really doing good work in practising Grandsire and Stedman.

#### NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Meetings have been held at Tiverton, Washfield, Huntsham and Hemyock, with an average attendance of 45. Ten new members have been elected, and six certificates have been awarded.

Cruwys Morchard and Uplowman bands have withdrawn.

The Branch now consists of 1 Honorary and 62 Performing members. Most of the bands seem to be keeping up to the same standard. Tiverton band, after an uphill struggle, has reached full strength again. Bampton are striving hard with Stedman Doubles and can ring the plain course.

Five members of the Silverton band, and one from Thorverton, visited Bickleigh on Dec. 7th, and rung a well struck quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles, the ringer of the treble (W. L. Selley), scoring his first quarter peal.

#### NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

Ilfracombe band has had a rather unfortunate year, Mr. J. Sprague, having met with a bad accident during the summer, has only lately been able to take his place in the tower again. Also one of the band (J. V. Hussell), has left the town. Probationers are coming on, and there is every hope of regaining lost ground in the near future.

The first quarter peal has been rung on the new bells during the year, and the standard of ringing generally has improved.

At Combe Martin steady progress has been maintained. Two peal attempts were unsuccessful. Two date touches and one quarter peal have been rung for Sunday services, all members taking part. On Tuesday, Feb. 23rd, Bideford was visited, and the first quarter peal rung on the bells.

An attempt for a peal at Bideford on Easter Monday was lost through a shift course after 2½ hours good striking, the band being Rev. E. S. Powell, Mrs. Powell, Mr. T. Laver and five from Combe Martin. Two more peal attempts had been arranged since 1st Jan., 1933, but each had to be abandoned owing to illness near the Church.

#### NORTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

Peals of Grandsire Doubles have been rung at Ashwater, North Tamerton and Sutcombe, and a peal of Grandsire Triples at Bridge-rule with the assistance of Messrs. T. and W. Myers of the South-West Branch.

We are grateful to Mr. T. G. Myers for his encouragement.

Our isolated position tends to retard progress, but we mean to persevere and surmount all obstacles.

#### MID-DEVON BRANCH.

During the year three very successful meetings have been held at Torquay (Upton), Chudleigh and Paignton, the attendances having been above the average of previous years. A peal of Grandsire Triples was rung at Ashburton by four members of this Branch, and four of Exeter Branch, and a quarter peal at Paignton, conducted by Mr. E. W. Marsh. Sunday ringing and practices have been well maintained, and good progress made with Stedman at Paignton and Brixham. Visitors from other Branches would be welcome at these practices. It is with great regret we have to record the death of Mr. F. T. Gover, who was the first Chairman of the Branch, and who did so much to advance the art of change ringing in this district. An engraved brass memorial tablet has been fixed in the Paignton belfry, dedicated by the President on Oct. 22nd.

Cockington band has been handicapped by the illness of two of its members—Messrs. Olding and Dilling.

The collections during the year have made an addition of £1/9/3 to the Instruction Fund.

#### SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

Three meetings have been held, the Annual Meeting at Plympton, a Spring meeting at Kelly, and an Autumn meeting at South Brent.

The Kelly meeting enabled members to see the Guild memorial to the late Rev. M. Kelly, members being kindly entertained to tea by Miss Kelly. The President and Mrs. Powell were with us at Kelly and South Brent. At each meeting some excellent ringing was accomplished.

The outstanding event has been the meeting of the Central Council in Plymouth on the Tuesday in Whit week. The Council was made welcome in the Council Chamber by the Bishops of Exeter and Plymouth, and the Mayor of Plymouth, and the subjects discussed at the meeting were followed with keen interest. Excursions were arranged, three peals rung, and the Royal Hotel engaged as headquarters. The concert at a social meeting in the Assembly Room of the Hotel was a great success, the artistes, who gave their services, being much appreciated. The Secretary of the Council has expressed their grateful thanks for our hospitality, and the Guild can feel assured the visitors left Plymouth with pleasant memories, and praise for the cordial reception provided. Many of the visitors remained a day longer to attend the dedication of the Guild memorial at Kelly by Canon Coleridge.

Progress has been made by all bands, and kept at full strength by the addition of probationers. Practices in higher methods at Stoke have been continued, and members have visited the North-West Branch to render valuable assistance.

We have lost two honorary members through death, the Rev. E. Davies, Vicar of Charles, and Mr. C. H. James of Plymouth, the donor of the two treble bells at Charles' Church.
