*Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.*

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

*Glory be to the Father, &c.*

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

### AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

## GUILD RULES.

I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; and shall have for its objects—

The promotion of a reverent feeling among Church Bell-Ringers for their sacred office.

Belfry Reform; and

The cultivation of Change Ringing.

and that it be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates. The Bishop of the Diocese, being a member, shall always be Patron.

III. That duly qualified members shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, if proposed by a member and approved by the Committee (hereinafter called the General Committee); that the General Committee and the Branch Committees have also power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election be complete until the first subscription be paid.

IV. That any person subscribing not less than 5/- annually shall be an Honorary Member: each Performing Member or Associate who is attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member, shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild, but no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell in a touch of 120 changes.

Performing Members or Associates who are elected after September 30th in any year shall pay the sum of 1/- each as subscription for that year, which shall be sent to the general fund of the Guild.

Lady Associates shall become entitled to the certificate when they can ring 120 changes on an inside bell with hand-bells.

Associates shall have the privilege of being taught change-ringing by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, but shall not have the power of voting until they become members, such Instructors' expenses to be paid by the associates, or a proportion thereof, as determined by the General Secretary.

V. That Honorary Members may become Life Members on payment of £5.

Performing Members who do not reside in the County of Devon may become Life Members on payment of 5/-.

No life member will receive any pecuniary assistance or notices from the Guild unless he is specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

Not less than four Vice-Presidents (besides the Archdeacons, who, being Members, shall be ex-officio Vice-Presidents).

Honorary Secretary (hereafter known as the General Secretary); and

Treasurer (hereafter known as the General Treasurer) :— who, with five persons elected from the honorary members, together with one representative of each band in union, the chairmen and secretaries of local Branches, and the representatives on the Central Council, shall form the General Committee of Management :—of whom three shall form a quorum, the Committee having power to add to their number from time to time.

If a local Branch Secretary finds himself unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belonging to his own Branch).

If a representative member of the General Committee finds himself unable to attend a Committee meeting, he may select a deputy (who must be a member and belong to his own band).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time United Practice Meetings of the Guild.
- VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st. No member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.
- IX. That the expenses incurred by members (not being life performing members) in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may, when funds in the hands of the Committee admit, be paid by the Guild.
- X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.
- XI. That bands in union with the Guild undertake to ring on the great Church Festivals, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.
- XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing : should he do so he will be liable to immediate exclusion from the Guild.
- XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission of the General Secretary, who shall as early as possible bring the matter before the Committee either at an ordinary or a special meeting.
- XIV. That any alteration in or addition to the above Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be only made at an Annual, or a special General Meeting convened for that purpose.

## RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. Every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. The Secretary of the Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.  

He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date, the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him) retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch a counts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. The election of Branch officers shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. The Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on application from the Branch Secretary.
5. Each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. The Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

## REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

Continued activity and well attended meetings reported by all Branches indicate steady progress during the year. It is gratifying to learn that higher methods are being practised in various districts.

At the Annual General Meeting held in Exeter on Whit-Monday the Rev. E. S. Powell announced that he had accepted the benefice of a parish near Daventry, and at a Special General Meeting on September 2nd he definitely tendered his resignation of the Office of President. At this meeting the Rev. E. V. Cox was unanimously elected President, and the Committee offer their hearty welcome and best wishes for his success in the office. Having regard to Mr. Powell's twenty years' valuable services as an officer of the Guild, the Committee felt that some tangible acknowledgment should be made to him, and accordingly, with the authority of the executive, Mr. E. W. Marsh kindly undertook to invite subscriptions from all members of the Guild, and the Committee decided that a typewriter should be presented. Embodied in this report on page 10 is a copy of Mr. Powell's letter of appreciation and thanks.

The Committee record with regret the loss by death of the Rev. H. L. Pigot, a Vice-President and staunch supporter of the Guild for many years. The President represented the Guild at the funeral at Fremington on January 10th, 1934.

The Committee also have to express their regret on the passing of the Bishop of Plymouth, an esteemed Vice-President, and Mr. W. H. Marsh, Chairman of the South-West Branch for 10 years.

Six new Bands have become affiliated, and one Band has retired during the year. Fifteen peals have been rung, chiefly in the Grandsire method, but much work has been done in instructing new members, which the Committee hope will bring its reward in the years to come.

The finances of the Guild and the respective Branches are satisfactory, as will be seen from the accounts appended to this report.

## REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES.

### EXETER BRANCH.

Four meetings have been held during the year, at Ide, Upton Pyne, Kenn and St. Sidwell's, Exeter. As a sequel to the Spring Meeting at Ide, the Ide band became affiliated and credit is due to the St. Thomas, Exeter, band for its success in tuition.

Upton Pyne band has several keen members who are making good progress with Stedman Triples and Grandsire Caters by attending the practices at St. Sidwell's Exeter. At the Autumn Meeting at Kenn an appeal was made by Mr. A. T. Truman for assistance in instructing six recruits, who have since become affiliated, and several members of the Branch have been making weekly visits, it is expected, with good results. The Branch is indebted to its Ringing Master, Mr. W. Richardson, for his work in instructing novices at the weekly practice at St. Petrock's, Exeter.

Only two peals have been rung, partly due to the difficulty in getting the use of bells. What has been lost in this direction, however, it is hoped will be more than made up in the time given to instruction.

### AYLESBEARE DEANERY BRANCH.

Meetings have been held at Withycombe Raleigh, Honiton Clyst, Colaton Raleigh and Topsham with an average attendance of 50 members. The methods rung at these meetings have been Grandsire, Stedman, and Plain and Treble Bob. Fifteen new members have been elected during the year, and five have been awarded certificates.

At the Colaton Raleigh meeting we were honoured by the presence of Canon Coleridge, Master of the Oxford Diocesan Guild.

We congratulate the Withycombe Raleigh band on having scored two peals of Grandsire Triples, one at Broadclyst and the other at Woodbury.

Good progress has been made by the young band at East Budleigh under tuition from Littleham band. The removal of the Rev. E. S. Powell and Mrs. Powell has been a great loss to the Branch, but we wish them God speed in their new sphere of activity at Staverton, Northamptonshire. We have also to regret the loss by death of the late Rev. T. F. McCormick, an esteemed honorary member. The branch as a whole shows considerable virility, and membership has been well maintained.

### EAST DEVON BRANCH.

During the year three meetings have been held, at Honiton, Ottery St. Mary and Talaton, and all have been well attended.

We regret the loss sustained by the death of Mr. John Hine, an energetic member of Ottery band. Luppitt band still show keenness and ambition, and is making good progress with Stedman. Buckerell band has been practising St. Simon's Doubles, with

good result, and can now ring six-scores perfectly in four methods. Sidmouth band is going strong with Grandsire Triples. Payhem-bury and Sidbury have suffered by loss of members, but are making good with fresh recruits. Regular Sunday service ringing is reported from all bands in the Branch.

#### NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Meetings have been held at Tiverton, Bampton, Caiverleigh and Stoodleigh with an average attendance of 48 members. Bampton and Calverleigh meetings drew the largest attendance, over 60 being present at each place. The total number of performing members has increased from 66 to 77, seventeen new members having been elected and thirteen certificates awarded. Tiverton band, having been re-organised, now comprises five new members, and has succeeded in ringing a quarter peal of Triples.

Bampton band has made good progress with Stedman Doubles, and can now ring extents with the help of an extra man. Hunts-ham band has lost two good ringers who migrated to Bampton, but efforts are being made by Mr. Heard to bring on new members.

A first peal of Grandsire Doubles for two members and conductor was rung at Bickleigh (near Tiverton) in honour of Mr. R. Harris's silver wedding.

#### NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

It is with regret we have to record the passing of the late Rev. H. L. Pigot, who had been Chairman of the Branch since its formation. At the annual meeting held at Combe Martin the Rev. R. Seymour was elected successor in the Chairmanship. We also regret the loss by death of Mr. C. E. Cliff, an interested honorary member.

Ifracombe band has carried on regular Sunday service ringing under difficulties, having lost two members. One new member has since qualified, and two more are receiving tuition.

Combe Martin band have made good progress, five quarter peals of Grandsire Triples having been rung, whilst two attempts for a peal were unfortunately lost. The band have started practising the Plain Bob method.

#### NORTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

Considering the short time that this branch has been formed, and its comparative isolation, it is distinctly praiseworthy to note the keenness that is being shown. Members of the Branch have taken part in four peals in the Grandsire method. A feature of the Branch is the friendly feeling which seems to exist between members of the Guild and call-change ringers of the district. It is hoped that this may be a means of spreading interest in the objects of the Guild and increasing membership of the Branch. The work done by the Bridgerule band and the keenness of the Rev. W. H. Smale should ensure a bright future.

#### MID-DEVON BRANCH.

Three meetings have been held during the year, at Brixham, Teignmouth and Dartington with Totnes. The attendance of Branch members has been rather discouraging. Thanks to the help of members from the Exeter and South West Branches some good ringing has been done. A very successful joint meeting with the South West Branch was held at Buckfastleigh, thanks to Mr. A. L. Bennett's help.

Two peals of Grandsire Triples have been rung, at Wolborough and Kingsteignton. We regret the loss through death of Mr. W. Dilling of Cockington. Three new members have been proposed and three probationers are making good progress at Paignton. Sunday ringing and practices have been well maintained. Brixham bells have been augmented to eight, and the band are hoping for the assistance of other members for their progress in Triples.

#### SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

Three meetings have been held, at Lamerton, Petertavy, and Widecombe-in-the-Moor. The record attendances at these meetings indicate a revival of interest in the Guild, especially by the learners and younger members. Two new bands have been affiliated—Petertavy and Walkhampton—the clergy in each case learning change ringing with their bands, and assisted by members from Plymouth. Unfortunately the bells at these churches cannot now be rung owing to the dangerous condition of the bell frames. Members are being kept in practice at neighbouring towers until proposed restoration has been completed.

Three informal meetings have been held to discuss matters concerning the Guild and ringing generally, and these have been so helpful that more are desired. The Branch suffered a great loss by the death of its first Chairman, Mr. W. H. Marsh, on 18th July, and there are many ringers in Plymouth who are indebted to him for their tuition. By the death of the Bishop of Plymouth, a Vice-President of the Guild, the Branch has also lost a good friend. The departure of the Rev. E. S. Powell from the Diocese was much regretted in this Branch, where he was so well known. Our unanimous support is assured to the Rev. E. V. Cox with the hope that he may occupy the Presidential chair for many happy years. Plain and Kent Bob Royal and Stedman Caters are regularly practised at our ten-bell tower, and the special practices in Cambridge and London at Stoke have been continued with success. We appreciate the greater interest shown by the clergy in our work, and venture to express a hope that more will follow their example.
