Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

1. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; that its objects shall be—

To recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Workers;

To encourage ringing for Divine Service;

To promote order and good feeling among Ringers;

To cultivate the art of scientific Change Ringing, especially by giving instruction where it is desired; and that it shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates, and that the Bishop of Exeter, being a member, shall always be Patron, and the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons, being members, shall be Vice-Presidents.

III. That duly qualified members and associates shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, on being proposed and seconded, and approved by a majority of those voting; that the General Committee and the Branch Committees shall also have power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election shall be complete until the first subscription has been paid.

IV. That an Honorary Member shall subscribe not less than 5/- annually, or by a donation of not less than two guineas become a Life Member: and that each Performing Member and Associate attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member resident in the County of Devon shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild. That any Member or Associate elected after September 30th in any year shall pay half the subscription for that year which shall be applied to the general fund of the Guild.

IVa. That no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell through a touch of 120 scientific changes.

That Associates shall have the privilege of being taught by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, the expenses of such Instructors to be paid by the Associates and the Guild or a Branch of the Guild, in such proportion as may be determined by the General or Branch Committee as the case may be.

V. That persons resident outside the County of Devon may be elected Non-Resident Members on payment of 5/-, terminable on residence in the County. When a Performing Member, who has paid not less than five annual subscriptions, leaves the County, he may apply to be placed on the Non-Resident Members' list without further payment. Non-Resident Members will not be entitled to any pecuniary grant or notices from the Guild unless they are specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

At least four Vice-Presidents (in addition to the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons), a General Secretary, a General Treasurer, an Auditor, and five representatives from the honorary members, to sit on the General Committee. That the General Committee of Management shall consist of the foregoing, together with the representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, elected triennially at the Annual General Meeting one year previous to each Central Council session, the Chairmen and Secretaries of the local Branches and three representatives elected by each Branch, of whom five shall form a quorum. In the event of a casual vacancy among the Officers the General Committee shall have power to elect a successor to act until the next Annual General Meeting, and shall moreover have general powers of management subject to Guild or Branch rules. Nominations for any Guild Office, except those made by the General Committee, must be sent to the General Secretary fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting.

In the event of a Branch Officer or representative of a Branch being unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may appoint a deputy (who must be a member belonging to his own Branch).

VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual General Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time united Practice Meetings of the Guild.

VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st and no member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

That no peal shall be recorded in the Guild Peal Book or Annual Report unless all members taking part have paid their subscriptions.

IX. That the expenses incurred by resident members in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may be paid by the Guild when the funds in the hands of the General Treasurer suffice.

X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI. That bands in union with the Guild shall undertake to ring on the great Festivals of the Church, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.

XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing.

XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting adversely on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission from the General Secretary, who shall take the earliest opportunity of bringing the matter before the General Committee.

XIV. That any alteration or addition to these Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be made only at an Annual or special General Meeting, after due notice given of the proposed amendment.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. That every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. That the Secretary of each Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him), retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. That the election of Branch Officers and representatives on the General Committee shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. That the Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on written application from the Branch Secretary on the printed form provided for the purpose.
5. That each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. That a Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Guild Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

In presenting the sixty-first annual Report, the Committee are pleased to be able to comment favourably upon the attendance of members at the Annual Meeting at Ilfracombe and the numerous Branch Meetings during the year, although in some instances there is considerable room for improvement in the attendance of actual members of the respective Branches. The Committee are of opinion that the utmost care should be taken by the ringing masters or other responsible persons to prevent and, if necessary, to stop, any bad striking at meetings.

In the last Report the hope was expressed that there might be a larger number of peals rung during the year of King George's Silver Jubilee, but the number has been exactly the same, viz., 19. They comprised one of Grandsire Caters, twelve of Grandsire Triples, two of Stedman Triples, one of Bob Major, two of Bob Minor and one of Grandsire Doubles. Of these, two were rung at St. Thomas, Exeter and Brampford Speke to commemorate the Silver Jubilee. It is interesting to record that, during the year, 29 ringers have taken part in their first peal.

The monthly practices in 12-bell ringing at the Cathedral, open to all members of the Guild, have had to be discontinued since Whit-Sunday owing to extensive repairs to the walls of the South Tower. The Dean and Chapter were advised that it would be detrimental to the safety of the scaffolding, attached to the walls, if ringing took place. When these practices are resumed, it is hoped that a more regular attendance of members outside Exeter may be possible in appreciation of the facilities offered.

The repairs at St. Petrock's, Exeter, have also caused a cessation of the useful weekly practices which, it is hoped, it will be possible to arrange again before long.

This year we have to report a decrease of 18 in the total membership, and there are now 59 towers in union with the Guild.

We regret to record the loss of Archdeacon Emlyn Jones, one of our Vice-Presidents, elected to that office in 1932.

The General Account shows a credit balance of £58 0s. 5d., a gain on the previous year of £13 6s. 11d. The working of the Mid-Devon Branch has caused the Committee anxiety for some time, but with the appointment of Mr. A. L. Bennett as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer it is anticipated that there will be no further cause for anxiety. Meanwhile, a loan has had to be advanced to enable the Branch to carry on. It would appear desirable that all Branch accounts should be audited annually.

The Committee are grateful to the Clergy for their assistance in conducting the services at the meetings, and for the use of the bells for meetings and for peals; to the Honorary Members for their interest and support; and to all the Officers for their services during the year.

REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES 1935.

EXETER BRANCH.

The Branch meetings during the year at Thorverton, Kenton and St. Petrock's, Exeter, were all well attended, especially the meeting at Thorverton. The Kenton meeting was quite a success. A party from Exeter by coach visited Kenn, Powderham and Exminster and handled the bells of these towers with good effect.

We regret the loss of two honorary members during the year, through death, viz., The Rev. C. W. Bate and Mr. E. Sawdye.

The weekly practices at St. Petrock's, Exeter, which were so popular, have, for the time, had to be abandoned. It is hoped that these bells will soon be made available.

The defection of several members of Kenn band is disappointing, after the trouble taken in instruction. Consequently the membership of the Branch has fallen off a tenth from the previous year.

Sunday service ringing has been well maintained by all bands in the Branch, and progress in even bell methods is being continued.

AYLESBEARE DEANERY BRANCH.

Meetings have been held during the year at Whimble, Sowton, Withycombe Raleigh and Topsham, with an average attendance of 45 members. Grandsire, Stedman and Plain Bob were the methods rung at these meetings.

Five honorary members and seven performing and associate members have been elected, and three certificates awarded.

It is regretted that, owing to ill health, the Rev. E. A. Jullyan has been obliged to resign the office of Chairman, and at the annual meeting the Rev. G. Bateman was elected to the office. Withycombe band have sustained the loss by death of W. J. Manley, who always regularly attended the meetings of the Branch.

Sunday service ringing and weekly practices are generally maintained by all bands. The total membership now comprises 17 honorary and 89 performing and associate members, an increase on the previous year.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

During the year meetings have been held at Colyton, Ottery St. Mary and Payhembury, with an average attendance of 40 members.

Four members of Ottery St. Mary band took part in a peal of Stedman Triples at Ottery St. Mary on November 25th, conducted by Mr. C. R. Lilley.

Four new members have been elected and two certificates awarded. Ringing for Sunday services and the weekly practices have been regularly carried on throughout the year. The total number of performing members is 73, the same as in 1934.

NORTH EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Meetings have been held during the year at Tiverton, Washfield, Huntsham and Holcombe Rogus, the attendance averaging 36. Membership of the Branch has increased, sixteen new members having been elected.

Silverton band are still unable to use their bells pending repairs to the tower walls, but the band has kept together by weekly handbell practices, and periodical visits to neighbouring towers. Uplowman bells are undergoing restoration, and a new band has been formed and is affiliated to the Guild.

Instruction has been given at Huntsham, and a monthly practice arranged at Tiverton for members desiring to learn eight-bell ringing, but the attendance so far has been disappointing. In a peal of Grandsire Triples rung at St. Peter's, Tiverton, on November 24th, three members of Tiverton band took part.

The financial position of the Branch continues sound.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

During the past year the Branch has lost one honorary member, the Rev. F. Emlyn Jones, Archdeacon of Barnstaple, and one non-resident member, Mr. W. W. Stevens, both deceased.

At Combe Martin, one member, Mr. L. Walters, has called his first quarter peal of Grandsire Triples. The first 120 of Stedman Doubles has been rung and it is hoped soon to get through a plain course of Stedman Triples.

At Ilfracombe, progress has been retarded for want of recruits, but a more encouraging report is hoped for next year.

Sunday service ringing has been maintained regularly at both towers.

NORTH-WEST BRANCH.

Members have taken part in three peals, and two well-attended meetings have been held, the annual business one at Marland St. Peter, and the other at Werrington.

The real need of our Branch is for regularity on the part of all members at the weekly practices; until this becomes the general rule, there can be no steady progress in change ringing throughout the Branch. A quotation from the "Ringing World" may not be amiss: "What about the neglected practices, which, for want of *your* attendance, wears down the enthusiasm of others, prevents their progress, and may even lead to abandonment of these weekly practices altogether?"

The Branch has a great future before it, if it will make the most of its opportunities, and if every member will do his share for the sake of the Guild and its objects.

MID-DEVON BRANCH.

Since our last Annual Meeting, Mr. H. J. Hole has resigned the Secretaryship of the Branch owing to ill-health after fourteen years service.

During the past year meetings have been held at Wolborough, Cockington with Torre and Dean Prior with Buckfastleigh. There has been a decided improvement in the attendances in the two latter cases, and we thank the members of other Branches for their continued and valued support.

Bell restorations have taken place at Highweek and Totnes, and repairs to the bells have been carried out at Bovey Tracey. At Buckfast Abbey, also, the bells have been taken away to be recast and increased in weight.

During the year three excellent peals of Grandsire Triples have been rung in the Branch by mixed bands. Two of these were rung at Buckfastleigh, and one at Highweek.

It is to be regretted that there is a decrease in our membership, a number of Honorary and Performing members having withdrawn. Three non-resident Life Members, however, have been elected during the year.

The finances of the Branch have been a source of concern to your Officers. A temporary grant has been obtained from the General Secretary, and with this amount the accounts show a small balance in hand, but half-subscriptions (£1 12s. 11d.), are due to the Central Fund for 1935.

Regular Sunday Service and Practice-night ringing is reported, and the Collaton band are making good progress with Stedman Doubles.

In conclusion, we appeal to our members to give better support to the Branch meetings and affairs in the future, and also endeavour to increase our membership if possible.

SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

Attendance at meetings at Plympton, Kingsbridge and Whitchurch has fallen off, and the response from representatives of bands discouraging. At the Annual General Meeting a resolution was passed by which the Woodleigh Deanery was included in the Branch, and although at present the Deanery is not represented, it is hoped, in the near future, to extend the Guild's influence in this direction.

By the tragic death of Mr. W. J. Rundle in Emmanuel belfry the Branch has lost one of its oldest and most progressive members. It was mainly through his efforts that Surprise ringing was practised in Plymouth. The Branch was fully represented at the funeral.

Charles bells still remain silent pending attention from the bellhanger. Plympton St. Maurice bells are undergoing restoration and when this is completed, support should be given to Mr. Lavers in forming a strong band.

At St. Andrew's progress has been made in even bell methods and Cambridge Surprise Major, with special attention to regular striking.

All bands perform Sunday duty regularly, and in the celebration of the Silver Jubilee of our late King, took an active part.
