Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL.

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*

Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

- I. That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; that its objects shall be—
 - To recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Workers;
 - To encourage ringing for Divine Service;
 - To promote order and good feeling among Ringers;
 - To cultivate the art of scientific Change Ringing, especially by giving instruction where it is desired; and that it shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates, and that the Bishop of Exeter, being a member, shall always be Patron, and the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons, being members, shall be Vice-Presidents.
- III. That duly qualified members and associates shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, on being proposed and seconded, and approved by a majority of those voting; that the General Committee and the Branch Committees shall also have power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election shall be complete until the first subscription has been paid.
- IV. That an Honorary Member shall subscribe not less than 5/- annually, or by a donation of not less than two guineas become a Life Member: and that each Performing Member and Associate attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member resident in the County of Devon shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild. That any Member or Associate elected after September 30th in any year shall pay half the subscription for that year which shall be applied to the general fund of the Guild.
- IVa. That no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell through a touch of 120 scientific changes.
 - That Associates shall have the privilege of being taught by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, the expenses of such Instructors to be paid by the Associates and the Guild or a Branch of the Guild, in such proportion as may be determined by the General or Branch Committee as the case may be.

V. That persons resident outside the County of Devon may be elected Non-Resident Members on payment of 5/-, terminable on residence in the County. When a Performing Member, who has paid not less than five annual subscriptions, leaves the County, he may apply to be placed on the Non-Resident Members' list without further payment. Non-Resident Members will not be entitled to any pecuniary grant or notices from the Guild unless they are specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

At least four Vice-Presidents (in addition to the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons), a General Secretary, a General Treasurer, an Auditor, and five representatives from the honorary members, to sit on the General Committee. That the General Committee of Management shall consist of the foregoing, together with the representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, elected triennially at the Annual General Meeting one year previous to each Central Council session, the Chairmen and Secretaries of the local Branches and three representatives elected by each Branch, of whom five shall form a quorum. In the event of a casual vacancy among the Officers the General Committee shall have power to elect a successor to act until the next Annual General Meeting, and shall moreover have general powers of management subject to Guild or Branch rules. Nominations for any Guild Office, except those made by the General Committee, must be sent to the General Secretary fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting.

In the event of a Branch Officer or representative of a Branch being unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may appoint a deputy (who must be a member belonging to his own Branch).

VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual General Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time united Practice Meetings of the Guild.

VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st and no member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

That no peal shall be recorded in the Guild Peal Book or Annual Report unless all members taking part have paid their subscriptions.

IX. That the expenses incurred by resident members in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may be paid by the Guild when the funds in the hands of the General Treasurer suffice.

X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI. That bands in union with the Guild shall undertake to ring on the great Festivals of the Church, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.

XII. That no member shall take part in any competitive ringing.

XIII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting adversely on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission from the General Secretary, who shall take the earliest opportunity of bringing the matter before the General Committee.

XIV. That any alteration or addition to these Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be made only at an Annual or special General Meeting, after due notice given of the proposed amendment.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. That every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. That the Secretary of each Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.

He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him), retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts duly audited for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. That the election of Branch Officers and representatives on the General Committee shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. That the Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on written application from the Branch Secretary on the printed form provided for the purpose.
5. That each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. That a Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Guild Rule IX., and shall have the same authority over its members as is conferred by Guild Rule XII.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

With the issue of this sixty-third annual Report the Committee note with satisfaction that the interest of members in the objects of the Guild continues unabated, and all Branches have shown considerable activity during the year. The quarterly Branch meetings, of which twenty-four have been held, have promoted an improvement in method ringing and social concord, the essential elements of progress, although it does not appear that sufficient regard is always paid to the advantage of good striking.

Bands took their part in the celebration of the Coronation, and three peals were rung.

The Annual Meeting at Newton Abbot attracted a large attendance, and the proceedings throughout were evidence of good feeling and mutual help.

Twenty-six peals have been rung, but eight of these were brought round mainly by non-resident visiting members in higher methods that have not, as yet, come into general practice in our Guild.

Fifteen members have rung their first peal, and there were twenty-one "first peals in the method."

If these performances have had the effect of encouraging proficiency in the practice of these higher methods, the status of the Guild will be raised.

The Bells Restoration Fund has been well supported by collections at meetings, and after a grant to Clyst St. George of £3 3s., there is a balance in hand of £22 9s. 9d.

The Committee would again emphasise the importance of representatives of bands using every endeavour to obtain and educate recruits, in order to replace retirements and strengthen the position of the Guild.

The financial statement for the year shows an increased credit balance of £72 5s., which is deemed satisfactory.

The assistance of the Clergy of the Diocese in the conduct of periodical meetings and the continued support of the Honorary Members are much appreciated.

REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES 1937.

EXETER BRANCH.

Meetings have been held during the year at Ide, Teignmouth, (joint with Mid Devon Branch), Dunsford and Exeter.

The attendance at Ide and Teignmouth was disappointing, making it difficult for those who have to make arrangements. The Autumn meeting at Dunsford with Bridford and Christow was more successful, and everyone enjoyed the ringing at these towers, especially Christow, where the bells have been restored.

The annual meeting at Heavitree, Exeter, was very well attended, the Vicar of Heavitree (Rev. A. Johnston), who conducted the service, giving an address of welcome and an invitation to repeat our visit. He also kindly contributed £1 to the Branch Instruction Fund.

We have lost one honorary member, the Rev. A. H. Storrs, of Whitstone, by resignation. Membership of the Branch as a whole has kept up to the usual standard.

Sunday service ringing has been regularly carried on by practically all bands, and progress made in the practice of even bell methods.

AYLESBEARE DEANERY BRANCH.

Four meetings have been held this year at Honiton Clyst, Otterton, Withycombe Raleigh and Topsham, with an average attendance of 40 members. At these meetings Grandsire, Stedman and Plain Bob have been the methods rung.

The Branch have suffered a much regretted loss by the death of Mr. H. Leatt, an esteemed honorary member who regularly attended our meetings. Whimble band, which has now dwindled to two members, will, it is feared, drop out of the Guild.

The ring of six at Clyst St. George has been tuned, rehung, and reconditioned by Messrs. Taylor and Co., and is now in perfect ringing order. The membership of the Branch now comprises 15 honorary members, 87 performing and associate members in bands, and one unattached. Sunday service ringing has been well maintained. Five peals have been rung in the Branch during the year, all conducted by Mr. C. R. Lilley.

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Three meetings held during the year at Feniton, Honiton, and Payhembury were all well attended.

Sixteen new members have been elected and one certificate awarded. Our membership has now risen to 84 members in ten bands, and two unattached, which we believe to be the highest number for the Branch since its formation.

Broadhembury band, recently formed, has been busy making progress with Grandsire Doubles, thanks to assistance from Payhembury, for which the former are grateful. Harpford band is receiving instruction from Mr. B. Pike of Sidmouth, with the result that two members have become qualified.

All bands in the Branch report that Sunday ringing and practices are regularly attended.

NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Quarterly meetings have been held at Tiverton, Bampton, Calverleigh and Cadeleigh with an average attendance of 35 members. After the Cadeleigh meeting, members and visitors went on to ring at Bickleigh, Cheriton Fitzpaine and Cadbury.

Six new members have been elected, and two re-elected, bringing the total, after withdrawals, to about the same as 1936.

Cullompton band is making headway with the assistance of Messrs. A. G. Selley and C. Dymond, several members having rung their first quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles.

Silverton bells, augmented to eight, were re-opened on July 8th, and here the band is busy practising Grandsire Triples and training two or three young members. Tiverton band is struggling to regain its former prestige. At Calverleigh our Branch Chairman has recruited a band of enthusiastic girl ringers from the adjacent Ingleside School. This is believed to be the first Girls' School in England to have its own band of ringers.

Two of the oldest members of the Branch have passed away, Mr. Walter Snell, of Washfield, and Mr. Fred Taylor, of Tiverton. Mr. Snell was Ringing Master for several years, and Mr. Taylor's membership commenced in 1894. The Branch sent wreaths and was represented at the funerals.

All bands report regular practices and service ringing.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

Combe Martin band is still making progress with Stedman Doubles, and seven of the band can ring the extent, but practice on Stedman Triples has not been possible as yet. Service ringing is regularly maintained.

Ifracombe band is making determined efforts to regain its former status, and has several probationers who are being taught.

Grandsire Doubles with three covering bells is all that the members can manage at present, but they hope soon to be practising Triples.

West Buckland School Guild has made rapid progress under its leader, Rev. J. H. B. Andrews, and eight have qualified for certificates. Four of the band, with the assistance of Messrs. Hayward and Yeo of Combe Martin, rang their first peal of Grandsire Doubles at East Buckland on July 24th. Incidentally it was Mr. Yeo's first peal, rung in the tower in which he learnt ringing.

Unfortunately, the Rev. J. H. B. Andrews has now left the school, but it is hoped that the boys' interest in change ringing will not wane.

NORTH WEST BRANCH.

Meetings have been held at Great Torrington and Black Torrington, both well attended and testifying to unity of purpose.

Five members from Poundstock have been taught at Bridgerule and all have qualified for certificates.

Three peals have been rung, two of Grandsire Triples and one of Bob Major. The Branch is indebted to members of the Myers family of Plymouth for their valued help.

Sunday service ringing continues regularly at all towers in the Branch.

MID-DEVON BRANCH.

Satisfactory meetings have been held at Ipplepen, Bickington and Dartington, and also a joint meeting with the Exeter Branch at Teignmouth. Fortnightly practices at St. Leonard's Tower, Newton Abbot, have been devoted to Double Norwich Court, Bob Major, and Cambridge Surprise Minor.

The visit of a touring band, with headquarters at Newton Abbot, in July, and a peal at Buckfast Abbey in October, resulted in the election of seventeen non-resident members, with a gratifying addition to the Branch funds. We have now a balance in hand of just under £2, and can face the future with more confidence. Ten peals have been rung in the Branch, in two instances the first in the method for the Guild by a resident band, four of our members taking part. Mr. G. Browning, of Cockington, has rung his first peal at the age of 76.

We wish to thank all who have assisted in the work of the Branch during the year, and also the Clergy who have so readily granted us permission to ring.

SOUTH-WEST BRANCH.

Three meetings have been held, at Plympton, Modbury and Lydford, a noteworthy feature being the excellence of striking in the touches rung, and attempts to ring new methods.

Mr. G. H. Myers was the recipient of a silver bell ornament, presented by the Bishop of Plymouth on the completion of his jubilee as a ringer at St. Andrew's.

The visit of a touring band enabled Mr. T. G. Myers to ring his first peals of Cambridge Major and Royal. He is the first local member who has scored peals in the method on six, eight and ten bells. The problem of instructing outlying bands continues, and if ringers willing to learn would make more frequent visits to the city churches progress would result.

The importance of teaching learners to handle their ropes correctly cannot be too strongly emphasised.

All bands in the Branch report regularity in their Sunday service ringing, which appears to be appreciated by the Church authorities.
