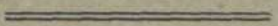

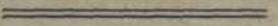

Belfry Prayers.

BEFORE PRACTICE OR RINGING FOR SERVICE.

Sanctioned by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese.

IT is hoped that the Clergy will encourage the use of these Prayers and by this means strengthen the connection of Ringers with the Church.

○ ALMIGHTY GOD, Who of old didst ordain the sound of the golden bells on the robe of the High Priest to be a figure of the Voice of Thy SON, the great High Priest; Grant that the sound of these our bells may be as a message from Him to the people, bidding them to come and adore devoutly in Thy Sanctuary; through the same JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

○ LORD, we beseech Thee mercifully to bless us who are appointed to the Ministry of calling Thy people to worship in Thy House; preserve us from evil, accident, and misfortune; give us the grace of reverence, and a sober mind; and bring us all hereafter to take part in the worship that the holy Angels offer Thee in heaven; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFICE BEFORE RINGING A PEAL

IN the Name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY GHOST. *Amen.*
Praise Him upon the well-tuned cymbals: praise Him upon the loud cymbals.

Glory be to the Father, &c.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through JESUS CHRIST our Lord. *Amen.*

AFTER THE PEAL.

THE Grace of our Lord JESUS CHRIST, and the love of GOD, and the fellowship of the HOLY GHOST, be with us all for evermore. *Amen.*

GUILD RULES.

That this Society shall be called 'THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS'; that its objects shall be—

To recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Workers;
To encourage ringing for Divine Service;
To promote order and good feeling among Ringers;
To cultivate the art of scientific Change Ringing, especially by giving instruction where it is desired;
and that it shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.

II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates; and that the Bishop of Exeter, being a member, shall always be Patron, and the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons, being members, shall be Vice-Presidents.

III. That duly qualified members and associates shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, on being proposed and seconded, and approved by a majority of those voting; that the General Committee and the Branch Committees shall also have power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election shall be complete until the first subscription has been paid.

IV. That an Honorary Member shall subscribe not less than 5/- annually, or by a donation of not less than two guineas become a Life Member: and that each Performing Member and Associate attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member resident in the County of Devon shall contribute annually the sum of 2/- to the funds of the Guild. That any Member or Associate elected after September 30th in any year shall pay half the subscription for that year which shall be applied to the general fund of the Guild.

IVa. That no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell through a touch of 120 scientific changes.

That Associates shall have the privilege of being taught by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, the expenses of such Instructors to be paid by the Associates and the Guild or a Branch of the Guild, in such proportion as may be determined by the General or Branch Committee as the case may be.

V. That persons resident outside the County of Devon may be elected Non-Resident Members on payment of 5/-, terminable on residence in the County. When a Performing Member, who has paid not less than five annual subscriptions, leaves the County, he may apply to be placed on the Non-Resident Members' list without further payment. Non-Resident Members will not be entitled to any pecuniary grant or notices from the Guild unless they are specially employed.

VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President.

At least four Vice-Presidents (in addition to the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons), a General Secretary, a General Treasurer, an Auditor, and five representatives from the honorary members, to sit on the General Committee. That the General Committee of Management shall consist of the foregoing, together with the representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, elected triennially at the Annual General Meeting one year previous to each Central Council session, the Chairmen and Secretaries of the local Branches and three representatives elected by each Branch, of whom five shall form a quorum. In the event of a casual vacancy among the Officers the General Committee shall have power to elect a successor to act until the next Annual General Meeting, and shall moreover have general powers of management subject to Guild or Branch rules. Nominations for any Guild Office, except those made by the General Committee, must be sent to the General Secretary fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting.

In the event of a Branch Officer or representative of a Branch being unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may appoint a deputy (who must be a member belonging to his own Branch).

VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual General Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time united Practice Meetings of the Guild.

VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st and no member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

That no peal shall be recorded in the Guild Peal Book or Annual Report unless all members taking part have paid their subscriptions.

IX. That the expenses incurred by resident members in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may be paid by the Guild when the funds in the hands of the General Treasurer suffice.

X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

XI. That bands in union with the Guild shall undertake to ring on the great Festivals of the Church, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the parish.

XII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting adversely on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission from the General Secretary, who shall take the earliest opportunity of bringing the matter before the General Committee.

XIII. That any alteration or addition to these Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be made only at an Annual or special General Meeting, after due notice given of the proposed amendment.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES

1. That every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. That the Secretary of each Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him), retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts duly audited for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. That the election of Branch Officers and representatives on the General Committee shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. That the Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on written application from the Branch Secretary on the printed form provided for the purpose.
5. That each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. That a Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Guild Rule IX.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE.

In this sixty-fifth Annual Report of the work of the Guild the Committee is confronted with a difficulty, common to all ringing organisations, in recording any progress under the conditions existing while the nation is in a state of war. A year, which opened with prospects of producing results as good, or better, than any previous one, has ended in placing all ringers' activities under a heavy cloud.

Up to the outbreak of war at the beginning of September, most Branch Meetings were held as usual, but since then there have been fewer meetings. For the most part, regular weekly practices have not been possible under the lighting restrictions, but in many towers Sunday service ringing has been maintained. It is most important that bands should endeavour to the utmost of their power to carry on their Sunday duties, thereby proclaiming the eternal message of joy, and uplifting the hearts of the people.

Many bands have been depleted by members being called up, or having volunteered, for National Service, and these members are distinguished in the list on pages 12 to 23 by the symbol † after their names.

At the Annual General Meeting at Plymouth on Whit-Monday it was resolved that Guild Rule xii, which forbade members taking part in any competitive ringing, should be deleted. Consequently that rule now disappears from our code, and Branch Rule 6 has been amended by the omission of the last paragraph.

Twenty-eight peals have been rung in the first eight months of the year, chiefly in the ever-popular Grandsire method, with one of Stedman Triples, two of Bob Major, five of Bob Minor, one of Stedman Doubles and one of combined Grandsire and Stedman Doubles. These peals afforded opportunities to 28 members to accomplish their first peal.

REPORTS OF LOCAL BRANCHES 1939.

EXETER BRANCH.

Generally the year has been a quiet one for this Branch, only two meetings having been held, the first at Exminster in February, which was fairly well attended. After this meeting, Kenton was visited for ringing.

The second, our annual meeting, at St. David's Institute, Exeter, in December, was supported by Dr. Carpenter, Dean of Exeter, the Rev. Chancellor McLaren, our President, and about 45 members and visitors. A short service conducted by the President preceded this meeting.

Two more attempts were made to hold meetings, at Ashton and Trusham, the first had to be cancelled owing to a local festival, and the second had to be abandoned through the war emergency and consequent rationing of petrol.

Ringling in Exeter has been practically at a standstill, through the "black-out," although combined practices on Saturday afternoons at St. Thomas have helped beginners.

At Brampford Speke, however, with concealed lighting, practices have been regularly continued.

It is hoped to resume practices again during the forthcoming summer months.

AYLESBEARE DEANERY BRANCH.

Owing to the outbreak of war only two meetings have been possible during the year, at Whimble and Colaton Raleigh, with an average attendance of 40. Methods rung have been Grandsire and Stedman Doubles, and Bob Minor.

Twelve new members have been elected, and two non-resident members. The Branch now comprises 11 honorary and 96 performing members in bands, and one unattached.

Thirteen peals have been rung in the Branch, nine conducted by Mr. C. R. Lilley, two by Mr. B. Pidgeon, and one each by the Rev. E. V. Cox and Mr. T. G. Myers.

Sunday service ringling has been carried on only partially, having had to be curtailed owing to the "black-out."

EAST DEVON BRANCH.

Meetings have been held during the year at Sidbury, Awliscombe and Luppitt, with an average attendance of 50, the largest being at Awliscombe with 70.

As a result of the Awliscombe meeting the local band became affiliated.

Five peals have been rung in the Branch, at Sidbury, Harpford (3), and Ottery St. Mary, all conducted by Mr. C. R. Lilley, for whose help we are most grateful. Nine certificates have been awarded, six of these being to members of Broadhembury band.

Owing to illness of members, the Honiton band have been unable to keep up their regular practices and service ringling. Sidbury band scored three quarter-peals of Grandsire Doubles during the summer, conducted by Mr. M. Denner. Feniton band is handicapped by an absentee on war service and another on the sick list.

All bands in the Branch have been obliged to suspend practices during the war, but are carrying on with their service ringling whenever possible.

NORTH-EAST DEVON BRANCH.

The year has been a fairly good one on the whole, meetings having been held at Tiverton, Washfield, Bradninch and Bampton with an average attendance of 34. An interim meeting was arranged at Huntsham on the occasion of the re-opening of the recently restored ring of eight, and this meeting was well attended and produced some excellent ringling. Several London ringers on tour joined the meeting.

There are now 3 honorary and 65 performing members (in bands) and one unattached, a total of 69, as against 84 in 1938. Washfield band, through unforeseen circumstances, has dropped out, but there is a possibility of a revival at some future date. Tiverton has also fallen behind this year. Calverleigh has gained the record for membership of bands.

Thirteen new members have been elected and eight certificates awarded. Nearly all bands maintain service ringling under the difficulties which have arisen through the war.

Silverton band has suffered the loss of a useful member in the death of Mr. M. Denford. A wreath was sent and the band attended his funeral.

NORTH DEVON BRANCH.

With the restrictions imposed by the war, Combe Martin tower had to be blacked out, but practices were resumed by the end of October. Since then some good progress has been made, Stedman and Bob Doubles can now be rung with certainty, and several courses of Stedman Triples have been brought round.

On February 12th, we lost by death our veteran member, Mr. J. G. S. Sanders. After his funeral a quarter-peal of Grandsire Triples was rung, with the bells half muffled, as a last token of respect to one who will be sadly missed by his colleagues.

Owing to the National Emergency two members of Ilfracombe band have left the tower ; I. J. Richards to aeroplane works, and R. J. G. Stuart to the Artillery. This has retarded progress, and, unless new members come along, the prospect of making any headway seems remote.

Sunday service ringing at both towers has been well maintained.

NORTH-WEST DEVON BRANCH.

The Branch held its Annual Meeting at Bridgerule on February 4th ; when four new members were elected.

One peal of Grandsire Triples has been rung at Bridgerule, conducted by Mr. T. G. Myers, in which 6 members of our Branch took part.

Sunday service ringing has been carried on regularly at Bridgerule, but practices have been abandoned through lack of support.

We must again acknowledge our indebtedness to our Plymouth friends for their kind assistance.

MID DEVON BRANCH.

During the year two successful meetings were held, at Totnes and Dartmouth. A meeting arranged for South Brent was cancelled owing to the international situation.

Practices held at Paignton during July and August were successful, and we thank Mr. C. F. Austin for obtaining these facilities. Our membership remains stationary, but our finances show an increase of 11s. on the year's working.

Only one peal was rung in the Branch during the year, one of Bob Major at Wolborough, in the spring, by the Guild of Clerical Ringers.

A number of our members have taken part in peals in other Branches, two of these peals being rung on a tour in North Devon, organised by Mr. E. J. Taylor, at Easter.

We again thank the various clergy for granting permission for ringing, and also members of other Branches for their continued support.

SOUTH WEST BRANCH.

Two meetings have been held, the Annual Meeting at Tamerton Foliot being exceptionally successful. At this meeting the Bishop of Crediton gave an address of encouragement.

Emmanuel Church bells have now been restored and are in ringing order.

Practices have been suspended in the emergency, but Sunday service ringing is still maintained.

It is hoped to resume meetings again with the advent of daylight evenings, and the possibility of increased transport facilities.
