GUILD RULES.

- I. That this Society shall be called "THE GUILD OF DEVONSHIRE RINGERS"; that its objects shall be—
To recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Workers;
To encourage ringing for Divine Service;
To promote order and good feeling among Ringers;
To cultivate the art of scientific Change Ringing, especially by giving instruction where it is desired;
and that it shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof.
- II. That it shall consist of Honorary Members; Performing Members; and Associates, and that the Bishop of Exeter, being a Member, shall always be Patron, and the Suffragan Bishops and Archdeacons, being members, shall be Vice-Presidents.
- III. That duly qualified members and associates shall be admitted at any meeting of the Guild, on being proposed and seconded, and approved by a majority of those voting; that the General Committee and the Branch Committee shall also have power to elect members at any Committee meeting; and that no election shall be complete until the first subscription has been paid.
- IV. That an Honorary Member shall subscribe not less than 5/- annually, or by a donation of not less than two guineas become a Life Member; and that each Performing Member and Associate attached to a band in union, and each unattached Performing Member resident in the County of Devon shall contribute annually the sum of 3/- to the funds of the Guild. That any Member or Associate elected after September 30th in any year shall pay half the subscription for that year which shall be applied to the general fund of the Guild.
- IVa. That no one shall receive the certificate of the Guild as a Performing Member until the Committee are satisfied that he has rung a changing tower bell through a touch of 120 scientific changes.
That Associates shall have the privilege of being taught by competent Instructors appointed by the Guild, the expenses of such Instructors to be paid by the Associates and the Guild or a Branch of the Guild, in such proportion as may be determined by the General or Branch Committee as the case may be.
- V. That persons resident outside the County of Devon may be elected Non-Resident Members on payment of 5/- terminable on residence in the County. When a Performing Member, who has paid not less than five annual subscriptions, leaves the County, he may apply to be placed on

the Non-Resident Members' list without further payment. Non-Resident Members will not be entitled to any pecuniary grant or notices from the Guild unless they are specially employed.

- VI. That at the Annual General Meeting in each year the members present shall elect from either the honorary members or the performing members—

A President. At least four Vice-Presidents (in addition to the Suffragan Bishop and Archdeacons), a General Secretary, a General Treasurer, an Auditor, and five representatives from the honorary members, to sit on the General Committee. That the General Committee of Management shall consist of the foregoing together with the representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, elected triennially at the Annual General Meeting one year previous to each Central Council session, the Chairman and Secretaries of the local Branches and three representatives elected by each Branch, of whom five shall form a quorum. In the event of a casual vacancy among the Officers the General Committee shall have power to elect a successor to act until the next Annual General Meeting, and shall moreover have general powers of management subject to Guild or Branch rules. Nominations for any Guild Office, except those made by the General Committee, must be sent to the General Secretary fourteen days before the Annual General Meeting.

In the event of a Branch Officer or representative of a Branch being unable to attend a General Committee meeting, he may appoint a deputy (who must be a member belonging to his own Branch).

- VII. That the General Committee shall fix the time and place of the Annual General Meeting, which shall always be held between Easter Day and the end of June in each year, and shall also arrange from time to time united Practice Meetings of the Guild.

- VIII. That all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st and no member whose subscription is three months in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of membership until arrears be paid.

That no peal shall be recorded in the Guild Peal Book or Annual Report unless all members taking part have paid their subscriptions.

- IX. That the expenses incurred by resident members in attending ringing meetings arranged by the General Committee, may be paid by the Guild when the funds in the hands of the General Treasurer suffice.

- X. That the ordinary times of practice of each band in union be stated in the Annual Report.

- XI. That bands in union with the Guild shall undertake to ring on the great Festivals of the Church, if required to do so by the Incumbent of the Parish.
- XII. That no member shall forward any communication to the public Press reflecting adversely on any band in union with the Guild, or upon any member thereof, without first obtaining permission from the General Secretary, who shall take the earliest opportunity of bringing the matter before the General Committee.
- XIII. That any alteration or addition to these Rules, or to the Rules of local Branches, shall be made only at an Annual or special General Meeting, after due notice given of the proposed amendment.

RULES FOR LOCAL BRANCHES.

1. That every Branch shall be governed by a Committee consisting of a Chairman, a Secretary (who shall also act as Treasurer), and one member from each belfry in the Branch. Incumbents of parishes forming the Branch (if members of the Guild) shall be ex-officio members of the Branch Committee.
2. That the Secretary of each Branch shall collect, and forward to the General Secretary not later than January 31st in each year, a correct list of members and reports of the work of the Branch and of its individual bands during the past year.
He shall also send to the General Treasurer by the same date the subscriptions of the members for the current year (including those of honorary members collected by him), retaining not more than one-half for local needs, and the Branch accounts for the past year. The subscriptions of members elected subsequently shall be sent to the General Secretary not later than December 31st.
3. That the election of Branch Officers and representatives on the General Committee shall be made at the Annual Meeting of the Branch.
4. That the Committee of the Branch shall have the same power as the General Committee to elect members of the Guild, and to award Certificates, which will be issued by the General Secretary on written application from the Branch Secretary on the printed form provided for the purpose.
5. That each Branch shall be represented on the General Committee by the local Chairman and local Secretary, whose travelling expenses may be paid by the Branch.
6. That a Branch Committee shall have the same right to make grants to its members attending Branch meetings as is given the General Committee by Guild Rule IX.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE

The past year has, on the whole, been one which the Guild can regard with sober satisfaction, although the picture which emerges from a study of branch reports shows that as regards new members, new methods, and the awarding of certificates, more progress has been made in the eastern half of the county than elsewhere. The problem facing those branches and towers where membership is falling and interest fading is a very difficult one, and the burden falls most heavily on the branch officials. Guild members can best help to overcome these difficulties by regular attendance at Sunday ringing and practices, and by supporting their branch meetings.

Membership has fallen slightly to 585, approximately the figure at which it stood at the end of 1948. The number of certificates awarded, however, shows a steady increase, 42 having been issued this year as against 14 in 1948 and 24 in 1949. We welcome Shute and Woodbury towers which have been added to our number during the year.

The annual Festival at Ottery St. Mary was well attended, and a most enjoyable day was spent. It was with the greatest regret that we received the resignation of our General Secretary, Mr. F. C. Smale, who for ten years had untiringly and devotedly given of his best for the Guild. The fact that the Guild emerged from the dark days of the war years in such good shape is very largely due to his unselfish work on its behalf.

Twenty-four peals have been rung during the year, and once more we were pleased to welcome touring bands of non-resident members. We congratulate the Honiton Clyst band on ringing the first resident peal of Oxford Bob Triples.

Amongst those who have died during the year we would specially mention Mr. J. H. Godfrey, a Vice-President of the Guild, whose work as secretary and treasurer of the East Devon branch for 24 years meant so much to its members and paved the way for its splendid increase in membership during recent years.

In conclusion, we would like to thank all incumbents who have so kindly allowed us the use of their bells, and also those clergy who have conducted our Guild services. We must never forget that the welfare of the Guild lies to a very large extent in the hands of our branch secretaries, and we are very grateful to them, and to all other branch officers for all their loyal help, whilst not unmindful of the able work of our General Secretary and General Treasurer.

CENTRAL COUNCIL.

This year the Central Council for Church Bell-Ringers met at Eastbourne and the deliberations were attended by Messrs. A. L. Bennett, E. W. Biffin and T. G. Myers.

SUMMARY OF BRANCH REPORTS

AYLESBEARE DEANERY.—Three meetings were held during the year, with an average attendance of 60. Practices continue to be well-attended, and in addition to the usual methods progress has been made in Double Norwich and London Minor. Plenty of beginners are coming on. Three peals have been rung, in which six members scored their first peal of Cambridge Minor.

EAST DEVON.—Good progress has been maintained throughout the branch during 1950, and the number of members stands at 135—a record. Meetings have been well attended and helpful practices have taken place in several towers. No peals have been rung, but several quarter-peals have been brought round.

EXETER.—Activity in the branch has been very encouraging, especially at Thorverton, Newton St. Cyres, St. Thomas, Upton Pyne, and at Tedburn St. Mary. Heavitree has suffered through the illness of Mr. C. G. Glass, to whom we wish a speedy return to health. Our membership has slightly improved and the four meetings held during the year were well attended. It is anticipated that the new ring at St. Mark's will be installed early in 1951.

MID-DEVON.—The past year has again been one of activity. Seven meetings have been held, as well as a joint meeting with the South-West branch. As a result of two outings a number of outlying districts in the branch have been visited. Expenditure has been abnormal, but our finances are still satisfactory.

NORTH DEVON.—Our membership has fallen this year owing to the dropping out of the Ilfracombe band, which we much regret. At Combe Martin the peal rung on July 26th was much enjoyed, and we were also glad to ring a quarter-peal of Grandsire Triples for the Ninth Centenary of the Diocese. Ringing has temporarily ceased owing to extensive repairs to the tower.

NORTH-EAST DEVON.—Four well-attended meetings have been held, together with a joint meeting with the Taunton branch of the Bath and Wells Association. Six certificates have been awarded. The recruits at Calverleigh continue to progress and we are pleased to report a revival of interest at Huntsham. Quarter-peals have been rung at Tiverton and one at Silverton where the conductor, D. Brooks, was the youngest member of the band prior to his being called up for the Services.

NORTH-WEST DEVON.—Two very enjoyable meetings were held at Holsworthy and Bideford, and our thanks are due to the incumbents for the use of two first-class peals of bells. We much regret to report that our membership this year has fallen from 69 to 48, and would appeal for more support from members at meetings and practices.

SOUTH-WEST DEVON.—Successful meetings were held at Revelstoke, Plympton St. Maurice and Shaugh Prior. Two peals, a half-peal and a number of quarter-peals have been rung by members of the branch, whilst four certificates have been awarded. We much regret to report a further drop in membership due to a falling-off of interest outside Plymouth.

OXFORD BOB TRIPLES

This method, in which the Honiton Clyst band have rung the first peal by resident members of the Guild, does not appear in any of the modern standard text-books, but as it is very musical, easier to learn than Stedman for a band which has only mastered Grandsire, and well worth ringing by any band, brief particulars of it are given below in the hope that others may be encouraged to learn the method.

It will be seen that, as in Grandsire, the treble has a plain hunting course, and that another bell—in the plain course the 2nd—is "in the hunt." Briefly, the work consists of Grandsire Doubles on the front five, with two bells dodging in 6—7 from the time the treble and the hunt bell leave behind until they return there.

Duty of each bell after making third's place :

1. Pass the treble in 5, 6—Lie, 3 pull dodge in 6, 7 down, lead.
2. Pass the treble in 2, 3—Dodge 4, 5 up, make 5ths, lead.
3. Pass the treble in 3, 4—Make 5ths, dodge 4, 5 down, lead.
4. Pass the treble in 4, 5—3 pull dodge 6, 7 up, lie, treble turns you, lead.
5. Treble turns you from lead, make thirds, lead again.

The bob is made exactly as in Grandsire Doubles by the front five bells, the bells in 6, 7 not being effected. Singles are unnecessary, but two special calls are required for peals.
